Labor and teams, including engineer and fireman ..... 476 95 Supplies for two engines, including wood and coal ..... Cost of surveying .....

Total cost ..... \$572 31

Recapitulation.

Dimension of street paved, 265 feet, 70 foot width: number of square yards, 2,061; cost to grade, crush and lay the rock, \$2.16 per front foot; cost per square yard, 27.77 cents; flint rock used, approximately 750 tons.

Soft Graded Paving.

Mr. Dodge, in order to show what a will do on a softer graded street, has built a roadway through the block on Liberty street between West Main and Garden.
