

MEMORIAL DAY WILL BE DULY OBSERVED

Hon. Francis P. Fleming Will Make Address of the Day.

DECORATION OF THE GRAVES

Both Chapters of the United Daughters of the Confederacy Will Honor the Dead by Sprinkling Flowers Upon Their Graves—Today's Program.

Today is Confederate Memorial Day, when loving surviving comrades and devoted wives and daughters will honor the departed heroes, who died in the defense of a cause which they believed to be right and just, by placing fragrant flowers upon their graves.

This custom will be universal throughout the South, because it is a day loved and respected by every Southern heart, regardless of age or standing.

The day will be properly observed in Gainesville, as usual. An interesting program has been arranged, which is as follows:

Members of J. J. Finley Chapter, U. D. C., will assemble at the home of the president, Mrs. W. B. Taylor, 108 East Orange street, at 8:30 o'clock this morning, where carriages will be awaiting them. The Chapter will proceed to the cemetery, where the graves of the departed heroes will be strewn with fragrant flowers as a token of the love and esteem to which these heroes of the 60's are worthy. The Chapter has consented with pleasure to unite with the U. C. V. in their exercises, and will return in ample time for the ceremonies and address of Ex-Governor Francis P. Fleming, which will occur at the court house at 11 o'clock.

Stonewall Camp, United Confeder-

ate Veterans, extended to Hon. Francis P. Fleming, ex-governor of Florida and one of the most eloquent orators in the State, an invitation to visit the city and deliver a memorial address on this occasion. Col. Fleming accepted, and will deliver the address at the court house at 11 o'clock this morning, to which the public is generally invited. The G. A. R. and both Chapters of the Daughters of the Confederacy have been invited, and all have consented to be present. The distinguished gentleman is well versed in the history of the Confederacy and the Confederate soldier, and his remarks are bound to please and interest.

Kirby Smith Chapter, U. D. C., will attend the ceremonies of the United Confederate Veterans at the court house at 11 o'clock this morning, when Ex-Governor Francis P. Fleming of Jacksonville will deliver an address.

Members of the G. A. R., local post, by special invitation of the U. C. V., will also be present and participate in the ceremonies.

The members of Kirby Smith Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy, will assemble at the home of Mrs. J. F. McKinstry, Jr., East Main street N., at 4 o'clock this afternoon, where carriages will be in waiting to convey them to the cemetery, where floral decorations will be placed upon the graves. The graves of Veterans in the Jewish cemetery will also be decorated, this honor having been awarded to Mesdames Wertheim and Burkhim and Miss Maud Graham.

At 5 o'clock this afternoon there will be a simple memorial service at the monument, court house lawn, to which the public is invited.

Miners' Wages Advanced.

Pueblo, Colo., April 25.—Announcements made that beginning May 1, the 5,000 employees of the Colorado Fuel and Iron company plant in this city will receive an advance in wages varying from 7 to 20 per cent. The office employees and superintendents will receive from 10 to 20 per cent advance, while the men in the mechanical departments will receive an average increase of 7 per cent.

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
