Vater Consumers Have Been Accustomed in Some Instances to Procrastinate in Payment for Service, but in Future Supply Will be Stopped.

There has been quite a revelation in waterworks and water supply department of the City Council, and in future the council declares that if a water taker fails to pay his rent promptly, or within the time prescribed, which is quarter, the superintendent will be required to cut off the supply without further notice and said service cannot be turned on again until the amount for the quarter, and a dollar extra for the connection, is paid.

LUCAS BLACK MARRIED.


Was Wedded to Miss Mamie Beach of South Carolina on the 10th.
