

## WATER COMMITTEE WILL ENFORCE RULES

Consumers Must Pay Up or Suffer  
For Want of City Water.

### THE RULES WERE ABUSED

Water Consumers Have Been Accused in Some Instances to Procrastinate in Payment for Service, but in Future Supply Will be Stopped.

There has been quite a revelation in waterworks and water supply department of the City Council, and in future the council declares that if a water taker fails to pay his rent promptly, or within the time prescribed, which is ten days after the beginning of each quarter, the superintendent will be required to cut off the supply without further notice and said service cannot be turned on again until the amount for the quarter, and a dollar extra for the connection, is paid.

This action, which was in the form of a resolution passed by the council at its last regular meeting, it is said was born of the fact that many consumers have abused the rules of the council in regard to payment of water rents, with the result that a great many of them who used water freely became several weeks in arrears. The rules of the city have always been, as everywhere else, that the service be paid for in advance, with ten days' grace. At the expiration of this time the rules provided if payment had not been made, the service to be immediately discontinued.

But there seems to have been a non-enforcement of this rule, however. Not because the persons authorized to act were intimidated, but more on account of the embarrassing situation were they lenient. There is nothing to do now, however, but to enforce the order regardless of feeling in the matter, since the resolution demands enforcement.

### Must Comply With Rules.

The resolution further provides that the committee on water supply are instructed to supply each water taker with a copy of rules to be observed in the use of water, and that the committee be instructed to use any available means to see that said rules are absolutely complied with.

City Clerk and Treasurer Dell, who has had the collection of water rents in charge, has been relieved of that duty and the same will in future be collected by T. B. Ellis, city tax collector.

The resolutions above referred to went into effect on the 15th inst. and those interested will be governed accordingly.
