NEWS FROM THE RACERS.

Word is Received From Them by Marconi Wireless Telegraph.

New York, May 27.—The German racing yacht Hamburg led the Endymion and Aliso by 136 miles in the transatlantic race for Emperor William's cup on May 22.

All three of the yachts were sighted by the steamer St. Louis on that day. The Aliso was leading the Endymion by about 2 miles. A light southeast breeze prevailed. The Hamburg had light variable winds. This information was sent to the Associated Press by Marconi wireless telegraph from the St. Louis by a round about route which resulted in considerable delay in its transmission. From the St. Louis it was given to the steamer Campania by the Campania to the Marconi station at Seconset and thence to New York.

On the following day May 23 the Aliso and the Hamburg were sighted by the steamer Minnehaha. Both the yachts had moderate southerly winds and a smooth sea. The Aliso was 1,061 miles due east of Sandy Hook lightship. The Hamburg when sighted by the Minnehaha she was 1,187 miles due east of the lightship. At the time she was sighted was not given in the dispatch received from the Minnehaha by Marconi wireless, however, the relative position of the yachts cannot be determined.


