"To the Honorable State Board of Gentlemen-Is the event that the University of Florids is loeated at Gainesville, we, the undersigned, here by bind and obligate ourselves to do nate and deed in fee simple to the 3tate Board of Education, for the use of said University, (1) flve hundred acres of land ad joining the said eity of
Gainesville, and, in addition thereto Gainesville, and, in addition thereto, to donste and turn over to asid board land, and, together with and in addi and, and, together with and in addi-
tion thereto, the 15 aeres in Eass Gainesville, including the public shool buildings and grounde ; either he one or the other, as you may elect and that the city of Gainesville wil furnish water for the University with out charge. And we further bind ourelves to rive any guarantee gou may require that, in the event the fira proposition is accepted, to torn over to said Board of Control, free of charge,
