

A MORNING TRAGEDY OCCURRED AT HAGUE

Officer Hague Was Compelled to Kill Man He Tried to Arrest.

MANY SHOTS WERE EXCHANGED

Officer Hague Attempted to Arrest Will Hunter Upon a Charge of Carrying Concealed Weapons—Hague Shot Five Times.

There was a tragedy at Hague Tuesday morning when Deputy Sheriff W. O. Hague, in an attempt to arrest William Hunter, was compelled to kill him to save his own life, according to reports. Deputy Sheriff Hague, it is said, was struck by balls from Hunter's pistol five times before he succeeded in bringing the man to the ground.

From the best information obtainable, it appears that Officer Hague approached Hunter and attempted to arrest him. Hunter resisted arrest and stopped backward, immediately drawing a pistol, when he opened fire. Officer Hague, realizing his danger, pulled his own pistol and began to fire, with the result that he killed his man.

Officer Hague was taken to his home and medical assistance was summoned from Gainesville. Examination showed that Hague was hit five times below the abdomen, every shot from Hunter's pistol taking effect. While the wounds are painful, the physician states that they will not necessarily prove serious and that the patient will recover.

The community regrets the occurrence, as both men are well known in the Hague settlement.

Hunter was about twenty-three years old and was the son of Hiram Hunter, a well-known farmer of that section.

The funeral of the dead man will occur today.

Mrs. J. B. Johnston, Dade City, grammar, reading and geography.


Mrs. Ella LaF. Hamilton, primary department.
