Dallas is a new postoffice on the south line of Marion county.

Orange growers at Lotus are having a hard time with the rust mite.

Brooksville again has a bank, but the people there would much prefer an ice factory at present.

E. F. Britton is appointed to fill Z. L. Burdick's unexpired term as postmaster at Seabreeze.

H. S. Jaudon of Savannah has secured the contract for putting in the waterworks plant at Perry.

Cotton picking has begun at Haynesworth, although the continued rains have interfered with the work.

Mayor Bowman of Crystal River, who has been re-elected, is a hustler and the right man for the office.

If Putnam county don't go dry on September 26th it won't be the fault of the W. C. T. U. The union is in the fight.

The plans for Tampa's new Central school building are now completed. It will be of brick and stone and cost \$80,000.

It cost \$10,000 to take the Ward Line steamer off Triumph reef below Miami. There were ten boats in the deal. The work was quick done.

The people of Ocala have been booming Ocklawaha on Lake Weir, and many from the Brick City are camping along this beautiful lake.

The Jacksonville saloon men who insist on selling liquor on Sunday have to put up an extra sum to the courts. Two were caught July 30th.

Dr. E. L. Potter of The Clarendon at Seabreeze has leased The Breakers for a term of three years with the option of purchasing at the end of that time.

The Atlantic, Gulf & Pacific Dredging Company will commence to dredge the Tampa harbor \$400,000 worth at once. This will give them enough water for the largest vessels.

The case of Owen Loadholtz and Mrs. Freeman will come up in the criminal court in Jacksonville September 7th. Loadholtz is the man who shot Miss Brown in the court room.

The forest fire in the vicinity of Canaveral, Brevard county, last month, must have been fierce. A man passing along there after the fire counted the carcasses of seventeen deer which had been burned to death.

The Jacksonville Produce and Fish Company has just received four new refrigerator cars, the first of a large order. These cars will be for the exclusive use of this big Florida concern.

FLORIDA OFFICER KILLS MAN.

While Attempting to Arrest Man He Also is Fatally Shot.

Plant City, Fla., August 18.—J. B. Passmore, white, was shot and killed on Main street here by Night Policeman A. Elam and Elam was fatally wounded by Passmore. Passmore was drinking, it is said, and raised a disturbance, when Elam arrested him.

Passmore drew a pistol and fired, the bullet striking Elam in the shoulder. Elam seized the pistol, but Passmore, being much more powerful, shot again, striking Elam in the stomach, inflicting what will probably prove a mortal wound.

Elam managed to draw his pistol, and shot Passmore five times, the latter endeavoring to fire again until shot to death. Elam is in a critical condition from the wound in his stomach.

MAMMOTH CITRON CROP.

California Growers Will Raise 30,000 Carloads of Fruit.

Los Angeles, Calif., August 18.—From recent estimates made of the citrus crop for next year, indications point to a record breaker. That there will be upward of 35,000 carloads is certain and the aggregate may reach forty thousand cars.

The current year ends Oct. 31, with shipments that will total more than 30,000 cars, and the daily average now is about 20 car loads.

Returns for shipments this season show that the Southern California Fruit exchange will have distributed \$7,000,000 to growers for fruit shipped from its members. Close calculations upon the output for next season place the net amount that will come to the growers at about \$12,000,000.
