Former congressman and governor of Virginia, Mr. Charles T. O'Farrell, died at Richmond, Va., today.

Francis H. Peabody, member of the Boston banking firm of Kidden, Peabody & Co., died suddenly of heart disease at his home at Beverly Cove today. He was 74 years of age.

The American steamer Bar Racouta, Captain Turis, last night reported to have sailed from San Francisco for Nikolaievsk, has been seized by the Japanese north of the island of Sakhalin.

Tagnol, French charge d'affaires at Caracas, Venezuela, expects his passport today in view of the impossibility of making the explanation demanded by Senor Ybarra, minister of foreign affairs.

Rev. W. T. Capers, rector of the Trinity Protestant Episcopal church at Asheville, N. C., has accepted a call to become dean of the Cathedral at Lexington, Ky. His resignation has been tendered the Asheville church, effective Nov. 1.

The American Pomological society in biennial convention at Kansas City, resolved to urge all congressmen to use their influence to secure the passage of legislation looking to the reduction of icing and refrigerator charges for the shipment of fruit.

Colonel I. N. Walker, assistant adjutant general of the Indiana Grand Army of the Republic, died of uremia poisoning at Indianapolis today. Colonel Walker was widely known in the Grand Army of the Republic circles, with which he has been prominently connected for many years.

Atlantic City, N. J., Sept. 23.—At today's session of the New England Cotton Manufacturers' association Eben C. Wiley, of North Carolina, claimed that the loss through waste to a plant using 10,000 bales of cotton annually was 53,000 pounds or a waste of about 14 per cent. Robert Burgess, of Pawtucket, R.
