

WILL MAKE IMPROVEMENTS

Increase Output of Alachua
Mill Enormously.

WILL DOUBLE THE CAPACITY

Mill, which Originally Had a Capacity of 15,000 Feet, Will be Increased to 25,000 Feet—Forests an Unlimited Supply.

Lynch of Jacksonville, who repurchased the mill and timber lands of the Alachua Cypress Company at Fairbanks, on Newnan's Lake, has to make many improvements in the near future. The plant, which already a cutting capacity of 15,000 feet a day, will be increased to 25,000 feet. Mr. Lynch is a business man and that this increase will pay.

Lynch was in the city a day or two ago. He is a young man, possessed of business ideas and declares that it is not to put in a plant to cut 25,000 feet a day and use the timber in a comparatively short time than it will be cut 15,000 per day and prolong the operation.

"As far as the time of operation is concerned," Mr. Lynch said, "that is not a figure much. Naturally, cutting 25,000 feet a day will exhaust the timber in two-thirds the time a mill cutting 15,000; but there is a large timber on Newnan's Lake, and it is estimated that if we cut 25,000 a day it will require from twelve to eighteen months to remove all cypress from the lake."

"We are here to stay," continued Lynch. "We did not come here for speculative proposition, because we investigated this matter thoroughly and found a great deal of virtue and business principle in the deal we are going to stay here. We are going to pay out a great deal of money labor, but in the meantime we are going to try and make a good living out of it."

Lynch, who is in charge of the mill, proposes to employ a large number of hands, and there is no doubt but that he will make the new concern pay.
