LOVING CUP GIVEN DR. STROUSE

Pastors and Citizens Unite in Paying Him Tribute—A Word Spoken for Gainesville—Rev. Dr. Strouse Promises a Fine Meeting.

The Chautauqua at Bowling Green, Ky., was closed on the evening of October 10th, in a blaze of glory, says The Daily News of that city. In speaking of the event that paper says: "The surprise of the evening came just after Dr. Strouse arose to make the announcements. Before he had started Mr. Morgan Hughes stepped on the platform and asked to say a few words. He held a beautiful loving cup in his hand, which bore the following inscription: 'Presented to Dr. Clarence B. Strouse by the pastors and citizens of Bowling Green, Ky., as a token of their high esteem and appreciation, October, 1905.' Mr. Hughes is a few well-chosen words assured Dr. Strouse that the people of our city appreciated beyond expression the great blessings he had brought them—that his unselfish interest had toned their hearts, and the loving cup which he presented was only a token of their love. He congratulated him on the great success of the Chautauqua and Bible Conference and promised him unanimous support in the future.

"The great applause that followed was the most hearty ever heard under the tent and showed that he spoke the sentiments of all the people. Dr. Cabell arose and presented a beautiful bouquet from the ladies of Potter College. Dr. Strouse's reply was most touching. He expressed his appreciation most beautifully and all could feel that it came from his heart. He announced amid applause that the Chautauqua came out \$43 above expenses and that the management would donate that as a cornerstone for a beautiful chautauqua auditorium. Union Has Been Dissolved. Stockholm, Sweden, Oct. 17.—The union between Norway and Sweden existing since 1814, has been dissolved, both houses of the riksdag having passed the government bill repealing the act of union and recognizing Norway as a state. "Separate from the union with Sweden." The lower house adopted the bill without debate, but two or three members of the senate expressed the opinion that the dissolution was an irreparable misfortune and that the time would come when Norway would perceive the benefits of the union. Both houses subsequently passed the new flag law.
