

ROGERS WILL WORK FOR THE CONVENTION

Wants the Southern Baptists to Meet in Florida Next Year.

A MAMMOTH ORGANIZATION

Membership Represents Every Section of Southern States, and Comprises 8,000—Meeting to be Held in Jacksonville Today.

Rev. S. B. Rogers, pastor of the First Baptist Church of this city, expects to make his departure for Jacksonville this morning, where he has been summoned to meet a committee appointed from the State for the purpose of securing the next session of the Southern Baptist Convention. This convention comprises 8,000 delegates, representing every section of the South, and means a great deal financially to the section in which the meeting is held, inasmuch as it is not a charitable proposition, the delegates paying their own way.

"There is no reason why this convention could not and should not be held in Florida," remarked Mr. Rogers, who is at the head of the work of the Southern Association in this State. "At the last convention it was decided not to hold a meeting in future at any point where an auditorium insufficient for accommodating the convention would be furnished. This is apparently a difficult proposition, as a building capable of accommodating eight thousand people looks upon its face to be rather expensive. But we do not wish a fine structure. All we want is an auditorium sufficient for our demands, and a building of rough boards, so long as it is comfortable and properly arranged, will suit our needs. It would pay Jacksonville, Gainesville or any other city, to erect a rough building of this kind for the distinction and financial benefit that would accrue."

Mr. Rogers believes that the next Southern convention will be held in Jacksonville, as he feels that the progressive citizens of that city will come to the rescue with the funds for the erection of the proper building.

THE MINISTERIAL SOCIETY.

Interesting Meeting Held at the Court House Tuesday Evening.

In compliance with the call published in The Sun, the Ministerial Association convened at the court house Tuesday evening for the purpose of forming or organizing a charity branch of the association.

The meeting was called to order by Rev. Thos. P. Hay, chairman of the association, when Rev. S. B. Rogers of the First Baptist Church, who has always been an active worker, explained the purposes of the same.

The question of the organization of a charity branch of the association was discussed, and it was decided to organize an administrative board. As members of this board the chair appointed O. Matheson, chairman, Ferd Bayer, Dr. J. Prescott Bullock, and Mrs. John W. Tench.

Rev. T. J. Nixon of the First Methodist Church, Rev. S. B. Rogers and Dr. Bullock were appointed to draft by-laws governing the administrative board, said by-laws to be presented at the next meeting for approval.

The chairman was requested to appoint a committee on membership for the charitable association. This committee has not yet been announced. Mr. Hay reserving the privilege of making the appointments later.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

QUEER FREAK OF NATURE.

Ground Sank in Alachua, Making Perfect Well Fifty Feet Deep.

It has long been a matter of history, the peculiar formation of the soil in certain sections of the State, particularly in some locations in Alachua county, which results sometimes of the depression of the earth in a dimension ranging in a few feet to several hundred feet. Many demonstrations of this character have been made, in a few instances the earth sinking to a distance of two hundred feet.

One of the most recent of these peculiarities occurred in Alachua recently, when the earth suddenly sank, making a depression about fifty feet deep and five feet in diameter at the top, gradually diminishing to about three feet at the bottom. The sink created a great deal of interest in Alachua at the time, many people visiting the scene, but now it is a "thing of the past," and no attention is paid to it.

Turkeys, geese, ducks and chickens, and all animals not weighing when crated over 100 pounds, can be sent by express, and must be shipped not later than Monday, November 13th. Cane, potted plants and perishable things must also be sent not later than Monday, November 13th. Every District Commissioner has been sent a supply of shipping tags, and no other can be used according to directions of the President of the Fair Association. On boxes, barrels and crates use two tags, one with black print up, and one with red print up. Tack on securely. If you wish to sell your exhibits in Tampa, state your price in the small square on all red letter side of tags, and if I can find a purchaser I will help you to sell.

\$50,000 BONDS HAVE BEEN SOLD

Educational Bonds Recently Voted Brought Good Price.

LOCAL BANKS PURCHASED

Were Taken by First National Bank and H. F. Dutton & Co., Who Paid 101 1/2 for \$25,000 Each—Money for State University.

The \$50,000 educational bonds recently voted by the city of Gainesville have been sold, the purchasers being the First National Bank of Gainesville and the banking house of H. F. Dutton & Co., these firms taking \$25,000 each.

The bonds brought 101 1/2, and are payable in ten, twenty and thirty years, as provided in the ordinance.

E. Baird, J. S. Bodiford, and C. Matheson composed the board who floated the bonds.

These bonds will be used for educational purposes only, and the purpose is to devote the funds towards the University of Florida.
