

### MONTHLY MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL

That Body Decided to Purchase Dormitory Property.

PRICE NOT TO EXCEED \$8,000

Council Thought Exhibit of Boulware Springs Water at State Fair Would be a Good Thing, and Appropriated Money for That Purpose.

The City Council met in regular monthly session at the City Hall Monday evening. There were present Chairman Broome, and Aldermen Benson, Cushman, Hodges, O'Neill, Taylor and Wittstock, making a full board.

After the meeting was called to order the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The reports of the marshal and collector were read, received and ordered filed.

The following resolution was offered by Alderman Taylor and unanimously passed:

"Resolved, That the city attorney be instructed to prepare and submit to this council an ordinance (or resolution) instructing and authorizing the board of public works to buy, at a cost not to exceed \$8,000, the property known as the Dormitory; such property to be held for park purposes, or sold, as in the judgment of the board of public works is deemed best for the interests of Gainesville."

After the passage of this resolution the clerk read a number of bills, all of which, being found correct and properly approved, were ordered paid.

It was ordered that the light at the corner of Odd Fellow street and Palmetto avenue be added to the city light bill.

The question of introducing the celebrated Boulware Springs water at the State Fair was discussed, which resulted eventually in a motion by Alderman Benson that a sum not exceeding \$96.50 be appropriated to place Boulware Springs water on exhibition at the fair, all bills in connection with expense of same to be approved by the Alachua County Fair Association. Five members of the board thought it was a good thing, with the result that the motion was carried, five to two.

An ordinance to provide for the giving of bond by the members of the board of public works as bond trustees, and amount of same, was placed upon its first, second and third readings and passed.

A resolution was passed instructing the mayor to remove, or cause to be removed, all the encroachments of whatever nature on and off Factory street to the Seaboard Air Line Railway.

There being no farther business, the council adjourned.

Lynch, of the International Typographical Union, received word today that the American Federation of Labor has decided to levy on its members an assessment of 4 cents a week for four weeks. The money derived from this assessment of the members of the Federation of Labor will be turned over to the International Typographical union to be applied to the defense fund. The total amount thus raised during the four weeks will amount to about \$80,000.

Alexander, former president of the Equitable Life Assurance society was reported last night as being serious. He is confined to his bed for two weeks and has been unable to sit up more than a few minutes a day. He was removed to a sanitary here several weeks ago. He will not be able to leave Deerfield for several months even under the most favorable circumstances.

#### Died on the Stage.

In 1833 Edmund Kean was acting the part of Othello. He had uttered the words, "Othello's occupation is gone," when he fell into his son's arms and had just strength to whisper, "I am dying; speak to them for me!" and was heard by the orchestra. In 1850 Mrs. Glover took her last benefit, but was almost unconscious all the time she was on the stage, and died three days later. In 1858 Harley while playing Bottom in "A Midsummer Night's Dream" was struck with paralysis immediately after having uttered the words, "I have an exposition of sleep come upon me." He had to be carried off the boards and died within a few hours.
