

FALL TERM COURT BEGAN ON MONDAY

A Few Civil Cases Were Disposed of During the Day.

GRAND JURY WAS SELECTED

The Docket One of Heaviest in History of the County—Sixty-One Cases Before Grand Jury, of Which Five Are Charged With Murder.

The first day of the circuit court of the Eighth Judicial Circuit for Alachua county convened Monday, Judge J. T. Wills presiding.

The regular venire being exhausted in drawing the grand jury, the sheriff was instructed to summon a special venire of twelve for petit jury duty for the present week, and the venire was returned as follows:

K. Baird & Son vs. I. M. Putnam & Co., assumpsit. Verdict for plaintiff, \$262.

W. H. Cannon, Jr., & Co. vs. J. W. Williams, assumpsit. Verdict for plaintiff, \$116.43.

The grand jury empanelled for the term is as follows: Samuel Elliott Bauknight, foreman; Frank Boals, S. F. Waits, J. W. Burnett, A. J. Feaster, G. M. DeSha, W. P. Boulware, Wiley Hines, Henry Parrish, H. R. Stokes, E. D. Phifer, J. M. Beville, J. L. Crawford, C. V. McQueen, D. M. Bryan, S. L. Crews, F. W. Polk and E. A. Flowers. Mr. Bryan was selected to act as clerk.

State's Attorney Calhoun stated that the business before the grand jury at this term is very heavy. There are sixty-one cases, five of which are charges of murder. Attorney Calhoun believes that, with the heavy docket, five weeks will be required to complete the term of court.

Court will convene again at 9 o'clock this morning.

THE CIRCUIT COURT.

Second Day Spent in Case of Mrs. Beach vs. A. C. L.

The second day of the circuit court, outside of the grand jury room, was spent in the case of Mrs. Ann Beach vs. the Atlantic Coast Line, assumpsit, damage for the death of her husband at High Springs. The case occupied the entire day, and up to last night the evidence was not completed.

The court will convene again at 9 o'clock this morning, when the case will be resumed.

State's Attorney Calhoun says that the grand jury has one of the busiest terms in the history of the county. Of the sixty-one cases before the jury, five are charged with murder and thirty-four on charges of selling liquor in a dry county.

LIVE OAK DEMOCRAT DESTROYED BY FIRE

The Entire Printing Plant is Totally Wiped Out.

ORIGIN OF FIRE IS UNKNOWN

The Daily Democrat Had Been Published But a Week—Sherwood & Pound, Owners, Lose Heavily—J. O. LaFontisee Was Editor of the Daily.

Live Oak, Nov. 18.—At 2 o'clock this morning the office of The Daily and Weekly Democrat was burned, and the origin of the fire is a mystery. The fire company responded quickly and did good work, confining the fire to the block in which it originated.

The Democrat owned one of the best plants in the State, being valued at over \$15,000, and was insured for less than half of that amount, \$3,500 worth of new material having just been installed.

The daily, which had had only one week's run, will be issued tomorrow from The Crescent office.

The Daily Democrat, of which J. O. LaFontisee, until lately city editor of The Times-Union, was the news editor, gave promise of being a splendid success, and the owners, full of pluck and determination, will push it to the front. The Weekly Democrat has always been successful, and is one of the most prosperous weekly newspapers in Florida. It has been an important factor in the progress of Live Oak and Suwannee county, and its loss is felt by the people generally. It was, in every respect an up-to-date paper.

For the present Mr. and Mrs. Strout are stopping with Mr. and Mrs. Geo. W. Perry of North Gainesville.


