

WITH GREAT GLORY BIBLE CONFERENCE WILL BE OPENED ON SUNDAY NEXT

Session Will Begin in Afternoon.
Big Crowd Expected.

GEORGE STUART WILL PREACH

He Will be Assisted in the Opening Services by President Clarence B. Strouse and Splendid Choir Will be in Attendance.

"You may tell the people that the coming session of the Florida Winter Bible Conference, which is one of the largest in the South, will be larger and better this year than ever," remarked Dr. Clarence B. Strouse, president of the Conference, Tuesday.

"We have succeeded in making one of the finest programs ever seen in this country for the session which will open on next Sunday, the 11th inst. The meetings will be opened with an afternoon session, in which I will assist Dr. George B. Stuart of Virginia, who has been with us every year, and who is regarded as one of the finest workers and orators the United States has ever produced. George Stuart is a favorite here, as everywhere else, and never fails to draw large audiences and make his work count."

Dr. Strouse states that the program has been strengthened by the addition of Bishop H. C. Morrison of the Southern Methodist Church, New Orleans. "Dr. Morrison is one of the sweetest speakers and most effective workers I have ever heard," he said, "and has a broad reputation as a Christian and a man of sterling religious worth. In Dr. Morrison the Winter Bible Conference certainly has a sparkling jewel."

George Bagley, the famous American soloist who has sung with such success in the larger auditoriums of the North, has been engaged for the Conference and will open the session for the same at the afternoon service.

There will be two services Sunday, 2:30 and 7:30 p. m., followed by three services every day during the remainder of the Conference, with the exception of Sundays, when only two services will be held.

Dr. Edwin Hall, according to voluntary appointment, entertained a large audience at the auditorium of the University High School Tuesday evening.

The subject Tuesday night was, "How to Get Married and Stay So." It was a lively discourse, full of humor, mingled with good sense and was highly appreciated by Dr. Hall's hearers.

"You know, I love Florida, from what I have seen of it; I love the people because they have treated me cleverly; I love the birds and the flowers and the sunshine, which are sweet at this season of the year, and my whole heart goes out to God with gratitude that He permits me to live amid this glorious scene." These are Dr. Hall's remarks and as he loves all these things, he naturally loves to help the children and the cause of education and that is why he volunteered to give the lecture last night.

MEETING OF COMMISSIONERS.

Held Monthly Session Tuesday and Inspected New Iron Bridge.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular monthly session Tuesday, a full board being present. This was a meeting of unusual interest, since a large amount of business out of the regular routine was brought up and disposed of. Among the more important deliberations of this body was the inspection of the new iron bridge over Hog Town creek, recently completed under contract with the Virginia Steel & Iron Company, at a contract price of \$865. This structure is sixty feet long by twelve feet roadway, and is one of the best and most up-to-date in architecture in this section. The commissioners, accompanied by County Clerk S. H. Wienges, visited the bridge, a couple of miles from the city, and pronounced the job satisfactory in every way.

Mon. Chas. Hodge Here.

Hon. Charles Hodge of Alachua, in the last campaign a candidate for the Lower House of the Legislature with a platform that was to say the least impressive, was among the visitors to this city yesterday. Mr. Hodge has not yet made up his mind whether or not he will run during the coming campaign, but will announce himself later, should he decide to do so. His position on the divorce law is something which will be listened to with great interest by the voters and he has several other good points in his platform as well. Mr. Hodge believes that a marriage license should contain a stub, which should be retained by the husband, authorizing a divorce in the county judge's court at any time it is filled, with proper reasons endorsed thereon. He advocated this plan two years ago and it was a drawing card in many precincts.
