

ANOTHER LUMBER COMPANY STARTED

Timber Lands Amounting to Nearly 19,000 Acres Secured.

GREENVILLE YELLOW PINE CO.

J. R. Fowler of This City General Manager—A First-Class Saw and Planing Mill to be Located at Greenville.

One of Gainesville's leading lumbermen, J. R. Fowler, has been looking up new fields for operation, and after closing a successful season of lumbering at Lenoir, has been casting about, until now he has succeeded in getting hold of about 19,000 acres of fine timber near Greenville, Madison county, and in company with the J. S. Betts Lumber Company of Ashburn, Ga., the largest lumber concern in the State of Georgia, has organized the Greenville Yellow Pine Company, for the purpose of cutting out the timber, which it is estimated will amount to between ninety-nine and a hundred million feet.

The company is capitalized at \$100,000, and Mr. Fowler has been elected vice-president and general manager. A new double circular Filer & Stowell mill with a capacity of 72,000 feet per day will be put in and some of the machinery from the Lenoir mill added to it. Planers and a dry kiln will also be put in operation, and the concern will be complete in every detail.

A logging road will be built to get the logs to the mill and the work will be begun as soon as possible.

The tract contains yellow pine and cypress, the latter being in large quantities, and the firm will certainly strike it rich, as all are thorough mill men, and the prices paid for pine at the present time will bring them in a large revenue.
