FACES MURDER CHARGE.

Grand Jury Indicts Fleeman After the Coroner's Verdict.

Lexington, Ga., April 20.—A true bill was found against J. C. Fleeman by the grand jury here charging him with the murder of Charley Wilson the early part of this year. It will be remembered that Mr. Fleeman killed Mr. Wilson near Winterville, this county, and the coroner's jury returned a verdict of justifiable homicide. The case was called for trial Wednesday.

There is considerable interest in the case and the town was crowded as both parties are among the best families of the county.

Mr. Fleeman will be defended by Hamp McWhorter, Sam Sibley, P. Brown, E. P. Shull, Joel Cloud and H. C. Tuck.

Solicitor Meadows will be assisted by Colonel A. D. Watson, of the local bar, and G. L. Callaway, of Thomson, in the prosecution.

There are about forty witnesses to be examined and much interest will be manifested, and every point in the case closely contested by both sides.
