

MAJOR ACCIDENT AT FLORAL CITY

Shovel and Flat Car Were Wrecked Beyond All Repair.

TRAM TRAIN WAS BROKEN

Accident Occurred on a Curve, and the Track Was Torn Up So Badly That Trains Could Not Pass for Several Days—Steam Shovel Wrecked.

Floral City, Oct. 18.—A freight train was wrecked here this morning and a steam shovel and flat car are fit for nothing but a fire, and the track is so bad so that it cannot be repaired for the trains today. The accident occurred on a curve, which made the damage of the track worse. Several of the trainmen were in the wreck, but escaped with only a few scratches. The steam shovel was intended to be used in the yards at Lakeland, but it had to be practically rebuilt.

Campaign Funds Sued For.

Cincinnati, O., Oct. 19.—An accounting of the sum of \$170,012, alleged to be the amount of the Republican campaign fund for last year in this city, was demanded in a suit filed by Louis H. Keuz, a former city employe, who says he contributed \$15 to the fund. The petition asks for an accounting and for the distribution among the contributors of \$140,000, believed to have been in hand when the campaign expenses were paid. The finance committee and its individual members are made defendants. The petition gives among the alleged contributions the sum of \$6,250 from federal employes, \$625 from state officials, from private corporations \$59,500, and from public service and steam railways \$50,000. The suit was filed in the common pleas court.

The viceroy replied, it is said, that he was unwilling to discontinue the work for the reason that the commencement of the Whampoa road was anticipated by the owners of the Kow Loon line.

USED DYNAMITE TO CHECK FIRE.

Business Section of Seneca, Destroyed by Flames.

Columbia, S. C., Oct. 19.—The town of Seneca, S. C., was visited by fire, and property worth about \$75,000 was destroyed. The property was insured for \$25,000.

The fire originated in the Oconee Inn, a new brick hotel, which was totally destroyed. The Palmetto hotel, recently completed, together with the stores of Hunt & Harper, Luther Moore, and Stribling's pharmacy were burned.

Both hotels were well filled with guests and there were several narrow escapes. The doors of several rooms were forced in in order to rescue the occupants.

Rumors were circulated early that the fire was the result of incendiarism and was started by negroes in revenge for the destruction of a negro college by dynamite at that place on Sunday night last. Later investigation, however, showed that there was little on which to base the rumors. The negro population of the town did everything in its power to stay the progress of the flames.

As the town had no fire apparatus, it was necessary to use dynamite to check the fire.
