Madeline, imported direct from the island, was declared grand champion of the aged class, and Bluebells Dinah grand champion of the junior class. But in addition to this he is especially proud of the fact that his young Hereford bull, Col. Thomas J. L. Brown, named after the president of the Fair Association, captured the junior championship of the beef breeds."


