New York, Nov. 30.—All the old
officers of the Seaboard Air Line rail-
way company, with the exception of
Norman S. Meldrim, first vice presi-
dent, were re-elected at a meeting

Bellefontaine, O., Nov. 30.—Robt.
Albert died of spotted fever, making
the third fatal case of the disease
in the neighborhood within 10 days.
Neighbors were so alarmed at the
death of Mr. and Mrs. Newton Jos-
lyn, that they would not go to the
Albert home, where the wife and
baby were alone with the patient,
who was violent.

Five Cloudbursts Fatal.

Murphy, N. C., Nov. 30.—Five
cloudbursts on Fain mountain killed
two persons, wounded others and did
much damage to property and crops.
The bodies of Mrs. R. C. Cornwell
and an eight-year-old boy were found
near their home. The husband is
badly hurt, but a little daughter and
an infant escaped. Houses were
demolished and great holes torn in
the mountain sides.

Judge Overruled Demurer.

Indianapolis, Nov. 30.—Judge A.
B. Anderson, of the federal court,
overruled all the demurrers in the
case of the United States against the
National Association of Retail Drug-
gists and others and the defendants
were ordered to answer on the first
Monday in February. The case is

HOG AND HORSE.

Attacked by the Mad Farm Hand Who
Cut Flesh from Their Hips.

Princeton, Ind., Nov. 30.—Frank
Turner, aged 26, a farm hand in the
employ of John Redman, became sud-
denly insane and going to the barn,
slashed a valuable horse several times
across the side and hip, seriously in-
juring the animal.

When discovered by Redman he
was cutting strips of flesh from the
animal's hip and laughing hysterically.
When driven away from the horse
Turner gave chase to a hog, and on
catching it, slashed it across the back
with the sharp blade. He was final-
ly overpowered and disarmed by Red-
man, who locked him in the barn
until Sheriff Whiting could reach the
scene. He is now confined in the
county jail here, and the sheriff of
Martinsville, Ind., his former home,
has been notified to come for him.

Crutchfield Not Guilty.

Atlanta, Nov. 30.—The jury in the
case of the state against J. H.
Crutchfield, on trial in the superior
court upon the charge of having shot
his wife with intent to kill her, re-
turned a verdict of not guilty, after
remaining out one hour and twenty
minutes. While the verdict may be
a surprise to some, it was not to
Crutchfield, who, while waiting for
the jury to reach a verdict confident-
ly said: "I'll be acquitted. I know
it because the Lord told me so in a
dream, just as He told me in a dream
that my wife would not die from her
wound."
