

COTTON GROWERS MET IN HIGH SPRINGS

Fully Eight Hundred People Were Gathered in That Town.

MANY SPEECHES WERE MADE

Secretary Schell of the State Organization Made a Fine and Practical Talk, Advocating a Stronger and Richer Association.

High Springs, Aug. 3. The day was a great day in the annals of High Springs. It was the occasion of a big barbecue given by the Sea Island Cotton Growers' Association of Alachua county. Tom Price of High Springs was chairman of the affair and introduced Capt. T. H. Willard who made the address of welcome. Capt. Willard's well chosen remarks were much appreciated. He was followed by Sam Collins of Columbia county, who made a good talk.

F. G. Schell, secretary of State organization of cotton growers, made a very fine address. He urged the importance of making the association strong, and to take stock in a million dollar stock company to buy up all the floating cotton and hold same until it brings the minimum price named by the association.

A large crowd was present, estimated at about eight hundred people. In the afternoon there was a game of ball between High Springs and Mikesville, resulting in a score of 1 to 2 in favor of Mikesville.

SHOT AT NEGRO.

Allen Haile Would Not Tolerate a Colored Man's Foolishness.

Because he would not tolerate a negro's foolishness Allen Haile, a well-known young man of this city, shot at and may have struck Will Taylor, an employ of Dell & Haile, naval stores operators, at a late hour Saturday afternoon.

From what could be learned it appears that Taylor had gone to work for Dell & Haile, who own a place at Paradise, on Monday, and left his work Thursday, having put in only four days' time. He came to the city Saturday, looked up Mr. Haile at his home, and with a threat said he would "have his money or go to h—." He made several threats to Mr. Haile, which finally resulted in an exhaust of patience and reason, when Mr. Haile went into the house, secured a gun, and fired.

It is not known whether any shots took effect, as the negro made haste from the scene of the shooting, and has not been heard from since.
