

DRAWNS THE COLOR LINE.

First Iowa Educational Institute to Exclude Negroes. Chicago, Sept. 14.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Des Moines, Iowa, says:

Highland Park college of Des Moines has drawn the color line. This is the first Iowa educational institution to exclude negroes and the action has caused resentment among the thousands of negroes in the state.

The negro Baptist associations of Iowa and Nebraska in session here, Friday condemned the college's action and declared it the greatest setback the race has had in Iowa.

Highland college had an enrollment of 2,500 students and several negroes have been in the classes. President Longwell, in announcing the drawing of the color line, declared he had nothing personally against the blacks; that they had conducted themselves well, but that the white students compelled the action by refusing to attend chapel or walk into classes with the negroes.

RYALS HANGED AT BAXLEY.

Negro Rode to the Gallows Sitting Up on His Coffin.

Baxley, Ga., Sept. 14.—The negro assailant of Mrs. Overstreet, Neal Ryals, was hanged at this place at noon Friday.

He rode to the gallows, 600 yards from the jail, on his coffin, went up on the gallows unassisted, made a statement of about twenty minutes, saying he was innocent, prepared to go, and knew nothing about or who committed the crime for which he died. He said he had never before been arrested and had always led a Christian life; that he was ready to go. He then knelt and prayed aloud, again claiming his innocence. Then he walked on the trap singing and continued to sing until the cap and rope were adjusted, when he told the sheriff good by, and the trap was then sprung. He was dead in sixteen minutes.

Arraigned on Murder Charge.

New Orleans, La., Sept. 15.—G. A. Chapman, seventy years old, was arraigned in police court Monday charged with the murder of fifteen-year-old Fred Rosenblath Sunday. The old man pleaded not guilty and said that the shooting was accidental. He said that Rosenblath and other boys had annoyed him by calling him names and throwing rocks at his house, and that he fired his revolver to frighten them away. His aim was too low, he said, and Rosenblath was killed instantly.

Fearing Rabies, He Suicided.

Springfield, Ill., Sept. 15.—Fearing hydrophobia as a result of a bite inflicted by a squirrel suffering with rabies, Frey Peterson, forty-five years of age, died Sunday of carbolic acid poisoning. He swallowed the acid with suicidal intent, because, as he remarked, he preferred to kill himself rather than die of rabies. Five other persons bitten by the rabid squirrel are in Chicago undergoing treatment to prevent possible serious developments.

NEGRO LYNCHED IN TEXAS.

Was Charged with Implication in Murder of White Man.

Brookshire, Tex., Sept. 15.—Dave Newton, a negro charged with implication in the murder of John Buchtrin, a white man who was shot and killed at his home near here Friday, was taken from the jail Saturday night by a mob and hanged.

The father and brother of the negro lynched, under arrest in connection with the killing, have been placed in the jail at Hempstead to prevent further mob violence. Intense excitement prevails here.

Girl Was Fatally Burned.

Hempstead, L. I., Sept. 15.—While lighting a fire with kerosene in the kitchen of her home in East Meadowbrook, L. I., Carrie Snyder, the eighteen-year-old daughter of David Snyder was so severely burned that she died. In trying to rescue her, her mother was burned from head to foot and in a critical condition. Miss Snyder had been prominent in the Methodist church at Meadowbrook, which was donated to the town by Mrs. O. H. P. Belmont, and sang in the choir.
