

TRIP TO OCALA WAS A BIG SUCCESS

ENTHUSIASTS MADE QUICK TRIP TO BRICK CITY.

Members of Party Proceeded to Tampa, Where They Attended Meeting of the Auto Club.

Monday afternoon an automobile party left this city for Ocala for the purpose of further ascertaining the condition of the road between this city and that city.

The party, consisting of Messrs. A. Cushman, J. H. Alderman, W. N. Bennett, W. R. Thomas, Frank Hampton, B. Stringfellow, a representative of The Sun, occupied two cars—Cushman's Model 10 roadster, driven by Sam Bennett, and a new Buick-Detroit Model 30, driven by Frank Myers, left Gainesville at 10 p. m., arriving at Ocala at 5:20 a. m.

The road was found to be in good condition, with the exception of about 10 miles of sand, which comes in "patches." There was a noticeable amount of water, which has heretofore caused autoists considerable trouble. All low places have been filled in, and hands are engaged now in Alachua and Marion counties repairing the bad places in the road.

The trip was a most enjoyable one, the weather was cool and bracing. Ocala Messrs. Cushman, Thomas, Alderman, Wilson and Hampton attended the Seaboard for Tampa, where they went to attend the meeting of the Tampa Automobile Club last Tuesday. Messrs. Cushman and Alderman went as special representatives of the Gainesville Automobile Association with a view to induce the Tampa Automobile Club to declare the road via Gainesville the official route in the endurance race on November 4.

Sam Bennett, the chauffeur in charge of Mr. Cushman's Buick, said that he "knew a thing or two" about autos, as he handled the machine beautifully.

Rollins College Eleven Will Meet University Team Here.

IN PITIABLE CONDITION.

Young Drummer Temporarily Demented by Excessive Drinking.

C. C. Cash, a young drummer who has been in the Newberry section for the past number of days, was brought to Gainesville Tuesday by Deputy Tompkins and turned over to Sheriff Ramsey on a charge of insanity.

This man is in a most sad state of mind at the present time, due, it is said, largely to the excessive use of bad whiskey, cocaine, morphine, and probably other drugs, and it was seen that he needed medical attention at once, and Sheriff Ramsey summoned Dr. Dell, who stated that he was in a most serious condition.

From what could be learned the man sells computing scales and has been in and about Newberry for a number of days on a protracted spree, but the past two days he had become wholly unruly and it was necessary for the officers to take him in charge. He has some little money at the present time and his general appearance shows that he is a man who can command money, and after he has been restored to his right mind and cleansed of the opiates he will require some careful nursing and administering to him closely to save him from the present crisis.

He has been arrested a number of times at Newberry for drunkenness, but it was soon seen by the authorities that this procedure was useless, and it was thought best to send him here and turn him over to the county authorities.

NOVA SCOTIA'S BIG INFLUX OF TOURISTS.

PORTLAND, Me., Oct. 26.—Reports from Nova Scotia indicate that every town, village and country place was filled this year with American tourists. The United States consul at Yarmouth believes it possible that the money expended by the summer travelers in Nova Scotia, including fares, will approximate \$3,000,000.

During the four summer months, 16,311 people were carried from Boston to Yarmouth alone; to St. John's, N. B., were 25,000 more, while American visitors to Halifax were greater in number than in any other previous year, making an estimated total of more than 60,000 Americans visiting the provinces this summer, of whom 50 per cent were pleasure seekers.

BOSTON, Oct. 26.—It seems, according to population figures, that Director Charles F. Gettemy of the Bureau of Statistics will have the biggest job of any supervisor in the country in gathering in what information Uncle Sam wants concerning the inhabitants of Massachusetts; for, according to the last census figures, Massachusetts had 3,003,650 with the next largest district, New York, only 2,374,520. Cook county, Ill., is next with 1,837,735, and Philadelphia county, Pa., 1,393,697.

It is expected that 2,500 enumerators will be required for the work in Massachusetts this year, where 1,500 did it ten years ago. Applications are coming in with every mail to Supervisor Gettemy for positions to count noses in the Bay State.
