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No Place For Library.

Those who have been looking forward to the removal of the Public Library to a room in the new city building are doomed to disappointment. It will not be moved there.

At the meeting of the city council on Tuesday night the right room on the ground floor was assigned to the use of the city clerk, assessor and collector, and for use as a municipal court. The room above will be used as a council chamber. The room to the left on the ground floor will be utilized as a central hose house and will contain the fire apparatus. The rooms above are for the firemen.

The building has not yet been accepted by the city, but is now complete, except for furnishings. It has cost upwards of \$8,000 and is a very pretty building. It is probable that the architect and contractor will be ready to turn the structure over to the council at the next meeting of that body.

New Union Depot.

Supt. H. A. Ford of the Atlantic Coast Line Railway was in the city the other day and stated that his company would shortly get to work on a remodeling and enlargement of the Palatka union depot. When the plans of the company have been carried out it is stated that the depot will be not only a credit to the city but to the railroad company.

The new 70 lb. steel rails for this road have been laid to this city and the work is being pushed south as rapidly as possible. When the new track is completed the Atlantic Coast Line in Florida will be over a road bed second to none in the south. The company is also getting ready to dispense with city water by sinking drive wells for flowing water in close proximity to the water tank. If the company succeeds in getting its own water it will mean no small loss to the city water company.

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STATE NEWS IN TABLOID

Madison is building a \$10,000 brick school house.

Several walking "blind tigers" have been arrested in Tallahassee.

Hon. W. N. Shonta has accepted the principalship of the Gainesville High school.

The "Black Kid" will be hung at Starke today, the first legal execution to occur in that place.

Rev. Dr. J. I. Norris, pastor of the Presbyterian church at Orlando has resigned to accept call to Pine Bluff, Ark.

The trustees of the Presbyterian college at Lake Eustis have bought additional ground and a building to be used for a dormitory.

Rev. Wm. J. Kenny of St. Augustine has gone to Canada to attend the funeral obsequies of his cousin, Rev. Father Divine.

Lon Sessions, a young white man of Alachua county, was shot and killed by some unknown person while riding through Neumansville last Saturday night.

St. Augustine has voted in favor of the Osmond electric lighting and street railway ordinance by a large majority. The work of putting in the system will begin at once and pushed to early completion.

Mayo is enjoying a building boom. A company composed of Masons and Knights of Pythias has let a contract for a building of brick and Indiana limestone to cost \$8,400. The building will contain a hall for these orders. The Presbyterians of the town are also going to build a new church.

Harry Bonford, charged with assault with intent to commit murder on Capt. Chas. L. Parks of Tampa, has been found guilty of aggravated assault. Bonford was found in Parks' home paying unlawful attention to Mrs. Parks, when the shooting occurred.

Six hundred dynamite caps exploded in the rear of Baird's hardware store in Gainesville Tuesday morning. Charles Hooks, the porter of the store, had both eyes blown out and his head badly mutilated. He had been sent for the box and noting that the cover was not on good bit it with a hatchet when the explosion occurred.

William F. Williams, frenzied with drink, shot the manager and two clerks in the clothing store where he worked on Tuesday. The manager, John White, was instantly killed. James White son of the manager and Ed. Dausby, salesmen, are mortally wounded. Williams is in jail. John White was a prominent business man of Pensacola for 30 years.

The Duval County Medical society has passed resolutions requesting daily papers in Jacksonville not to publish the name of any physician, a member of that society, connected with any case of a medical or surgical nature, on the ground that the papers are not capable of conveying a true idea of the illness or injury, thereby reflecting discredit upon the physician in charge.

D. E. Thompson, for the past six years secretary, treasurer and general manager of the Record Publishing company, publisher of the St. Augustine Record, has retired. The Record Publishing company was established by Mr. Thompson, and it is to his business ability and energy that its success is principally due. Mr. Thompson will continue to reside in St. Augustine.
