**SLAIN BY NEGRO.**  
**Captain Briggs Had Fatal Altercation with Black.**  
Capt. T. D. Briggs, of Homosassa, Fla., died there as the result of a blow by a negro named Chisholm. Chisholm is in jail at Inverness, where there is much feeling against him.  
Captain Briggs warned Chisholm off his hunting preserve and in an altercation the negro struck him a blow with his fist. No bad effects were feared at first, but an artery had been ruptured and several hours after the affair he became unconscious and died.

**LOG TRAIN WRECKED.**  
**Five Negroes Killed Near Green Cove Springs, Fla.**  
Five negroes were killed and more than a score injured when a logging train on the Bowling Shands Lumber Company railroad was derailed at a trestle, six miles from Green Cove Springs. Seven cars and an engine jumped off a trestle.  
It is thought a loose rail was the cause of the accident.

**Veteran Conductor Dies.**  
After a lingering illness of several months, Capt. W. H. York, 61 years of age, veteran conductor of the Florida East Coast railway, passed away at his home in Jacksonville. Captain York was stricken while in the courthouse building and was removed to his home. For years Captain York has been in the service of the F. E. C. railway, and was the oldest passenger service man in the employ of the road.

**STAMPING OUT CANKER.**  
**Great Progress Made in Fight on Pest in Florida.**  
Showing an appreciable decrease in the number of infected trees, the state plant board at its meeting in Miami heard reports which bear out conclusively the fact that citrus canker is being stamped out rapidly and effectively.  
The reports show that during the month of September just passed 124 canker infected trees were found in the entire state, against 700 in September last year. In August 219 infected trees were found against 1,345 found in August, 1915.

**FUDGE INDICTED.**  
**Florida Man Charged With Murder of Daughter.**  
The grand jury at Pensacola, Fla., has returned two indictments charging E. J. Fudge with the murder of his daughters, Tennie and Ethel, 14 and 11 years old, respectively. Fudge was arraigned and pleaded not guilty.  
The bodies of the girls were found in a deserted house in the outskirts several months ago. There was also a rifle in the cabin and a note indicating that the elder girl killed herself and sister rather than go to the poor-house.

**FLORIDA COTTON.**  
**Crop Is But 48 Per Cent of Ten-Year Average.**  
The department of agriculture estimates Florida's cotton crop this year at 48 per cent of a normal, compared with 62 per cent last year, and a ten-year average of 70. This was a falling off of 10 per cent during September.  
The Florida yield per acre is estimated at 86 pounds, lint, compared with 120 pounds last year and ten-year average of 123. The Florida acreage this year is 207,000, or 5 per cent more than last year.

**Another Link in Highway.**  
Another link in the national highway from Lake City in Columbia county, Florida, to the Baker county line, will be completed in the near future, it is reported. The road department secured an appropriation of \$5,000 by the county commissioners of Columbia county, which will be placed with a similar amount from the federal appropriation, for building a sand clay road from Lake City to the Baker county line.

**AN ORDINANCE**  
Requiring all Property Owners Owning Property Joining to or Abutting on the North Side of Marian Avenue to Construct Sidewalks between Wood Street and Adrienne Street on North Side of Marian Avenue Within the Limits of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida.  
Now be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Punta Gorda, in regular session assembled,  
Sec. 1. That the owner or owners of every lot, piece or parcel of land within the corporate limits of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida, which shall front on the north side of Marian Avenue between Wood street and Adrienne street in said Town of Punta Gorda, whether the same be owned in fee simple or held under any other title whatsoever, shall be bound to construct, and is hereby required to construct within thirty days after the passage and publication of this ordinance a good and sufficient sidewalk along, and around where same corners on a street or alley, the whole length and depth of said lots, piece or parcel of land so owned by him and fronting or abutting on the North side of Marian Avenue, said sidewalks to be constructed in the manner and to the width and out of the material set forth and described herein, and to conform to and with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the Clerk of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida, the said sidewalk to be five feet wide and to run and extend on the North side of Marian Avenue from Wood street to Adrienne street inclusive in said Town of Punta Gorda.  
Sec. 2. That said sidewalk or sidewalks shall be constructed in the manner and out of the following material:  
The base shall be composed of one part of cement to three parts of local sand crushed to a size of from one half to one and one half inches, and said base shall be three and one half inches in thickness. The whole to be mixed and composed of one part of cement to one and one half parts of sand, equal to the sample on file with the Town Clerk, or equal to any other good and workmanlike material to the satisfaction of the Street Committee of the Clerk of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida, which committee shall see that the proper grades are established, perfect uniformity is had and the work done in a substantial manner, and of substantial kind and quality of material, and said Street Committee may with the approval of the Council, or the in person, inspect and supervise such work as it progresses, and shall be required to report to the Council as often as may be required.  
Sec. 3. That in case the owner or owners of the lots, pieces or parcels of land fronting and abutting on the North side of Marian Avenue as mentioned in Section 1 of this ordinance shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance within the time prescribed herein.  
Sec. 4. That the work to be done by virtue of this ordinance shall be done under the direction of the Street Committee of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida, which committee shall see that the proper grades are established, perfect uniformity is had and the work done in a substantial manner, and of substantial kind and quality of material, and said Street Committee may with the approval of the Council, or the in person, inspect and supervise such work as it progresses, and shall be required to report to the Council as often as may be required.  
Sec. 5. That in case the owner or owners of the lots, pieces or parcels of land fronting and abutting on the North side of Marian Avenue as mentioned in Section 1 of this ordinance shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance within the time prescribed herein.  
Sec. 6. That the work to be done by virtue of this ordinance shall be done under the direction of the Street Committee of the Town of Punta Gorda, Florida, which committee shall see that the proper grades are established, perfect uniformity is had and the work done in a substantial manner, and of substantial kind and quality of material, and said Street Committee may with the approval of the Council, or the in person, inspect and supervise such work as it progresses, and shall be required to report to the Council as often as may be required.
