Back to another of its old tricks is the  
Times-Union.

Which one?

Making false statements about the drainage  
project.

That's the reason for the Times-Union.

Its owners want that kind of stuff pub-  
lished.

Want it or else would not permit it.

Its owners want corporation sentiment  
poured into the public ear.

Because—

The Times-Union is owned by the Atlantic  
Coast Line, the Florida East Coast and the  
Seaboard Air Line Railway Companies.

Because—

The Times-Union is NOT a newspaper—it  
IS a chattel.

And the Chattel of a Republican who con-  
tributed \$2,000 to elect a Republican Gover-  
nor of New York.

### CAREFUL WORK NEEDED.

When men build ships, they work from definite plans,  
and from keel to keel anchor everything that goes into  
them is calculated to a mathematical certainty to bring  
about the result of maximum efficiency with minimum  
cost of construction and operation.

While giving due consideration to important points like  
carrying capacity and seaworthiness, the main point that  
is before the builders is, will it float upon the waters and  
move about upon them.

This is the way real ships are built.

Coming now to the "Ship of State," which is a figura-  
tive ship, the same careful supervision is necessary to  
make it serve the purposes of its construction.

Everything must be calculated beforehand, everything  
looked after and everything determined in advance that  
will affect the serviceable qualities of that ship. The  
least mistake will cause it to become a stranded hulk on  
the rocks of disorder.

There are two distinct classes of workers on Florida's  
Ship of State—those who provide the load for it to carry,  
and those who provide the machinery to keep it going.

Harmonious working together of these two classes will  
insure a prosperous voyage; failure to work in concert  
will result in trouble and maybe disaster.

The Legislature of the State of Florida prepares the  
load for the Ship of State. It must also provide the  
motive power, and the one must not be heavier than the  
other is efficient.

Legislators who pass bills appropriating public money  
for proper public uses must also provide the machinery  
for raising it.

The State can not borrow money by Legislative action.  
The Constitution forbids it. It can only be done by a  
constitutional amendment.

Public money can not be spent unless the public treas-  
ury contains it in exact measure.

Those who legislate money OUT OF THE TREASURY  
must first LEGISLATE IT IN.

This rule must not be broken if the State is to be saved  
from the discredit of being on a scrip basis.

From an inspection of the bills carrying appropriations  
already passed, to which have been added appropriations  
that must be passed, and the bills providing revenue that  
have been passed, and are pending, it now appears—

THAT THE TWO WILL NOT BALANCE.

This comparison was made by a representative of this  
journal yesterday, and the difference between the amount  
appropriated to be paid out of the general revenue fund  
and the amount which can be raised by the means now  
provided will reach a total of nearly THREE-QUARTERS  
OF A MILLION DOLLARS.

It is impossible to give exact figures, because accurate  
calculation of new methods for raising revenue can not
