A Relic of the Civil War.

Capt. H. L. Wood, a resident of this place for nearly five years, came into the office last Saturday afternoon with a three-inch conical shell in his hand, which he claimed to be a relic of the civil war. He says he was digging post holes on his property here about three years ago when he struck some hard substance, which upon investigation proved to be a shell, and is probably the only shell that was fired by either side in this neighborhood during the war. The Union vessels entered the Halifax river through Mosquito Inlet, and had a brush with the Confederate troops at both New Smyrna and Port Orange. The Confederates retreated before superior numbers, but took their women and children with them and put them on the road to St. Augustine. When approaching this locality the Yankees fired one shell from their launches into the dense hammock, and this must be that identical shell, for there is no other way to account for its presence in the place where it was found. Mr. Wood presented the rusty relic to Major Bingham.
