### A CIGAR FACTORY.

IT IS AN ASSURED THING THIS TIME.

Mr. Entenza, of St. Augustine, Has Decided to Locate Here--The Building for the Factory is Being Put in Readiness.

A cigar factory for Starke is now an assured fact.

Mr. N. J. Jones has been in correspondence with Mr. M. Entenza, one of the leading cigar manufacturers of St. Augustine, for several weeks, and has succeeded in interesting our citizens in the establishment of such an enterprise here.

About three weeks ago, as the result of the interest shown by our citizens, Mr. Entenza paid Starke a visit to look over the location and ascertain what inducements would be offered him to locate here. He stated the conditions on which he would move his factory to Starke, and left with a favorable impression of our town. These conditions have been met by our business men, and Wednesday Mr. Entenza returned to Starke to select the location for the factory and make final arrangements for moving.

The factory will be located in the old Orange College building on West Call street, and the work of repairing the building and getting it in readiness has already begun.

Mr. Entenza is well-known to a number of our citizens, and has the reputation of making a high grade of cigars. He made the TELEGRAPH a pleasant call Wednesday afternoon, and informed us that he would begin work in Starke about June 7th with a force of ten men and would probably increase the number in a short while. A number of those employed by him have families, and it is probable that several cottages will have to be built to accommodate them. Mr. Entenza also said he would take a number of boys to learn the trade, and this will be a good opportunity for some of our boys who are now idle.

The securing of the establishment of this enterprise in our midst is a move in the right direction, and it is to be hoped it is but the initiatory step in the securing of other enterprises and improvements.

### A SHOOTING AFFRAY

It Took Place Sunday and One Man Seriously Wounded.

A shooting affray occurred about eight miles west of Starke last Sunday, in which Gee Parish was seriously, if not fatally, wounded.

The facts, as far as the TELEGRAPH could learn them, are as follows: It seems that bad feeling has existed between Parish and Charlie Phillips for some time, and Sunday Parish, accompanied by Will Wynn, met Charlie and Will Phillips and Morgan Brown, when some words passed between Parish and Phillips and a fight ensued in which both sides took part. During the row Parish was shot and it is supposed that Charlie Phillips did the shooting. The ball entered Parish's abdomen, puncturing the intestines and making a very serious wound.

Drs. A. P. Smith and E. L. Stewart were called to attend the wounded man Monday and performed a difficult surgical operation upon him. At last accounts he was getting along as well as could be expected under the circumstances.

No warrants were issued until Tuesday morning, when H. M. Parish, brother of the wounded man, swore out warrants charging Charlie Phillips, Will Phillips and Morgan Brown with the shooting. They were arrested and brought before Judge Malphurs for a preliminary hearing yesterday.


