The Savannah News of recent date refers to the legislative record made by Col. Jas. T. Wills in the most complimentary terms. The prominence into which Mr. Wills brought Bradford county by his brilliant oratory and conservative statesmanship is very gratifying to his constituents.

The Brooksville Star states facts in saying that the railroad commission bill was killed by its friends, and they would kill any measure, however badly needed.—Metropolis. The Brooksville Star states a falsehood when it makes that assertion, and the Metropolis endorses it. Anyone who visited the senate while in session and saw a majority of its members come up under Chipley's lark knows what killed the railroad commission bill.

The Ocala News seems to be very fond of licking the hand that beats it. The News opposed the bill for circumscribing Ocala's corporate limits, known as the Brown boundary bill. The Duval delegation in the legislature voted for the Brown boundary bill, and one of the Duval representatives accused Mr. Brown, on the floor of the house, of trading and conniving with the Duval senator to secure the passage of the bill. But the News always finds room to slobber over the little faction to which the Duval delegation belongs. Isn't such inconsistency or boot-licking enough to make a man cast up his "inards?" Better turn over a leaf and be democratic henceforth.

Some of the little cuckoo organs of the state tumble over themselves to abuse and vilify any man who is criticised by the Jacksonville paper which happens to be their idol. A little sheet called the Morning News, published down the road at a little town variously known as Ocala, Ocala and Okler, is one of the finest specimens of the parrot or cuckoo specie that the past few years have produced. Some time ago the Jacksonville Citizen referred to Dr. Gaskins as a "reformer," and the News caught up the refrain and cannot get over it. We wish to inform the News right now that there are no "reformers" (in the sense that the term is used) cuckoos or bootlicks in Bradford county. We are plain, straight democrats, and we do not await the message from Jacksonville, Pensacola or any where else to know on which side to flop. When the democratic party in convention speaks we put our shoulders to the wheel and help to make it turn whether the Times-Union or the Citizen or Mr. Chipley like it or lump it. Living in this democratic atmosphere it would be impossible for Dr. Gaskins to identify himself with the miserable factionalism that threatens to disrupt the party if he were not himself too sound a democrat to do so.

HASTY JUDGMENT.
 The Florida legislature has just finished, after two months of hasty work, and doing as little as ever performed by a body of lawmakers. Its members were lectured by the people to remedy certain evils and to enact statutes conferring benefits upon the state at large. Instead of that the journals will show that a majority of the bills passed were of a purely local character, and that in very many instances measures which would have been productive of great good to the people were ruthlessly slaughtered.—Times Union.

The Times-Union should not be so hasty in passing judgment on the actions of the legislature. While it is true that the legislature passed an election bill for the city of Jacksonville that is not altogether to the taste of the Times-Union and failed to pass the Jockey Club bill, a measure that Jacksonville seemed very much interested in, it has some very good laws to its credit and the Times-Union should not affix its seal of condemnation before these laws have been placed in operation.

If we are not mistaken the legislature which adjourned on the night of May 31st enacted some laws that will materially lessen the burden of taxation, and this is what we want. In the first place it extended the criminal jurisdiction of justices of the peace to cases finally

to the amount of \$300, and as a handmaid to this measure of reform it reduced the maximum fine in cases of gambling to \$100 in order that such cases might come within the jurisdiction of the justices of the peace. These measures alone will save to the tax payers thousands of dollars, for the reason that heretofore the dockets of our circuit courts have been largely composed of negroes who have been indicted for "skin" playing. These negroes have been confined in our county jails for periods of from four to six months, and the tax payers have been compelled to pay for their feed. In counties where sheriffs have vigilantly fulfilled the sworn duty of their offices this cost has piled up to an alarming extent, but under the operations of the bills mentioned above cases of gambling will be disposed of by the justice in whose district the offense is committed, and the cost of feeding this class of prisoners will be lifted from the shoulders of the tax-payers. If the offender is sentenced to jail the fine and forfeiture law makes provision for him to be hired at once, and then he is at least made self-supporting, and in some instances may be made to yield a revenue to the county.

Along the same line of economy is the enactment creating a fine and forfeiture fund in each county, out of which is to be paid the cost of criminal prosecutions. Forfeited bonds, state's attorneys' fees and the money derived from the hire of convicts are to be converted into this fund, and it is estimated that this, with an assessment of one mill, will fully meet the costs of criminal prosecutions in each county. In fact the law provides that an assessment of only one mill shall be made for this purpose, and the criminals who now appear before our courts may count upon paying the costs. The law makes it incumbent upon the courts to be self-sustaining. It says in effect that the people shall no longer be made to pay costs created by the criminal classes, but that the criminals must themselves pay for their devilment. This is eminently fair and just and we think that the body of men that has seen fit to so arrange our affairs richly deserves the highest encomiums of the people.

We might go further and mention other good measures that were enacted by the late session of the legislature if we could hope that the Times-Union would be convinced that its sentence is hasty and unwarranted, but there is no use. The legislature did not allow the Times-Union to "run things" and its nose is turned up—awfully up—so high, in fact, that the weight of all the thousands of dollars that will be saved by the laws already mentioned would not pull it back into its proper position.

FOR ECONOMY.
 Bradford's delegation in the legislature came out squarely for economy. Dr. Gaskins introduced a resolution providing for the reduction of the per diem of members of the legislature from \$6 to \$5 a day. The adoption of this resolution would have saved to the people \$6,000, but after a gallant fight for its adoption Dr. Gaskins was obliged to see it go down with other measures that failed to meet the approbation of a majority of the members. Mr. Wills introduced a resolution providing for the reduction of the mileage of members from 10 to 5 cents a mile, and made one of his eloquent speeches for its adoption, holding that they should receive no more mileage than persons who are compelled to serve the courts in the capacity of jurors and witnesses, but this was at least one instance where the eloquence of the orator of the house failed to carry its point, and his resolution shared the defeat of the one introduced by Dr. Gaskins.

On the following day the majority of the members will repair to their respective homes and constituents. It is with a feeling of regret that we reflect upon this early parting. In our role as State Printer we have been closely associated with them (especially the House) since they met, and do not hesitate to say that, as a body, the Legislature of 1895 will go down to posterity as being composed of the most conscientious, hard-working set of men that had assembled here in like capacity for many years. They have labored early and late, completely ignoring the old established precedent of adjourning from Friday until Monday in the early part of the session "in order to give the committees a chance to work them," and the Speaker of the House has not had occasion to send the sergeant-at-arms out to bring in members in order to get a quorum to transact any business that came before them.—Tallahasseean.
