

Sale of the G. S. & F.

An Atlanta special speaking of the purchase of the G. S. & F. by the Southern says:

"This deal has created a sensation in Southern New York circles. It is an entirely unexpected coup. The Southern by this secures a most valuable line. It runs from Macon to Palatka and its local traffic is very heavy. In addition to this, it has been an important connection at Macon with the Central Railroad, and the Seaboard Air line. These latter lines have been great feeders of the Georgia Southern and furnished it most of its southbound business. In return they received a great deal of northbound business, and the fact that the Southern railway has acquired control of the road will no doubt seriously cripple the interchange of traffic at Macon with these lines.

"In addition to this the line is an important feeder of the Plant system at its various Florida points, but there will probably be no changes in its relations with this line. It is understood that the Georgia Southern will hereafter be used as a feeder for the western system of the Southern."

Death of Mr. Campbell.

Mr. G. B. Campbell died at his home near this city Wednesday evening at about 7 o'clock of heart disease. He fell from his chair to the floor and when taken up life was extinct. Mr. Campbell had been a cripple for a long while, his right shoulder and arm having been paralyzed, but beyond a failing appetite had shown no symptoms of being worse.


