Advanced pupils from different parts of the county are constantly dropping in to attend the High school. They are wise. They will receive as thorough instruction at about half the cost of going outside of the county.



**Commissioners' Proceedings.**  
 The board met Wednesday, October 7th, pursuant to adjournment. Present, Messrs. Toqd, Crews, Clay, Blanton and Tumblin.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The tax books for 1895 were presented by Assessor L. D. Wall for examination. The books were received by the board, and the assessor was instructed to distribute them as the law directs.

A petition presented by B. J. Sapp et al. praying the board to grant a permit to the citizens of the 4th commissioners' district to seine Crosby, Rowell and Sampson lakes was granted, and it was ordered that the clerk of the board issue the permit, said permit to grant the privilege of taking fish for picnics, fish fries and home use only.

Circuit Court being in session the board adjourned until October 16th.

October 16th the board met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present.

W. N. Meacham presented his bond as county auctioneer and it was approved.

The board refused to make an appropriation for having the body of G. W. Parish exhumed and examined.

Mesdames Haggood and Scott were placed upon the invalid pension roll and ordered paid \$3 a month each.

The salary of the jailer was reduced from \$20 to \$10 a month.

The months of October, November, December, January, February, March, April and May were designated as the months in which deer shall not be chased, killed or in anyway molested.

Amounts of warrants issued in payment of bills, including payment for the assessment of county taxes for 1895, are as follows:  
 General fund, \$1094.70; pauper fund, \$68; fine and forfeiture, \$95.37; total, \$1258.07.

The board adjourned until the first Tuesday in November.
