

Tuesday's Elections.

Elections were held Tuesday in fourteen states of the Union and the Republicans won victories all along the line. Mississippi and Virginia alone were carried by the democrats. In Kentucky the republicans not only elected a full state ticket, but will also control the legislature. This assures the election of a republican to succeed U. S. Senator Blackburn. In New York the republicans swept the state with 60,000 majority. New York City was saved to the democrats and the Tammany tiger is again on top. The legislature is republican and will elect a republican to succeed Senator David B. Hill. Ohio went to the republicans with a plurality of 80,000. Illinois entered the procession with a plurality of 30,000. Nebraska goes with them too. "My Maryland" gives the republicans a majority of 15,000. Iowa is republican this year by 60,000 plurality. They made a clean sweep of bleeding Kansas. And Pennsylvania comes up with a republican plurality of 190,000.
