

### Mr. Call in Starke.

Senator Wilkinson Call arrived here last Friday at noon. He spent the afternoon in renewing acquaintance with old friends, and Saturday morning at 11 o'clock addressed a small audience at the court house. He spoke about an hour and strongly arraigned the corporations of the country for the part they are playing in politics. The senator could see nothing but evil ahead of the American people if they do not curtail the power of allied capital and put an end to class legislation. He thought that the next campaign would determine the destiny of the republic and declared that if the corporations triumphed at the polls civil war would result.

He quoted from figures compiled by eminent statisticians to show that the corporations, aided and abetted by class legislation, were robbing the poor people of the country of the necessities of life, and emphasized the statement that \$30,000,000 were being spent annually by the railroads in the giving of passes to corrupt legislation. These figures and others of surpassing enormity he asked his hearers to take home with them for consideration.

He did not reiterate his statement that 140 newspapers in Florida are subsidized by the railroads, but did not fail to pay his respects to Brother Porter, of the Baptist Witness, saying that even some teachers of the religion of our blessed Jesus Christ had bowed the knee to corporate influence.

The Senator touched lightly upon the financial question, but in substance told his hearers that the men who favor gold to the detriment of silver are in touch and sympathy with the corporations and the money power, and are likewise trying to oppress the poor classes to gratify their own greed for gain.

When he had finished his address Mr. Call was roundly applauded and many of his hearers stayed to shake hands and talk with him. He left on the 2 o'clock train for Jacksonville.
