CO-OPERATION IN SCHOOL MANAGEMENT.—Part Second.

There are few teachers, we presume, who do not urge upon their pupils the importance of an education and expatiate on the advantages which accrue as a result of one's being properly educated. When a teacher does so the pupils naturally expect to find in him an example of the truly educated person. Consequently when they realize that their teacher is incompetent to perform the ordinary duties of business, of citizenship, of social life; that he is ignorant of the world, of literature, of history, of current events; that he is rude in his manners, sloven in his dress, depraved in his tastes and not ambitious for higher accomplishments it is but natural that such pupils should fail to be inspired by him with a love for study and a desire for an education. Co-operation is lost as a natural consequence. It is likewise natural that parents with a larger knowledge of what an education should be like will lose interest in the school and fail to co-operate with the teacher.

Interest begets interest. The teacher who enters upon his new duties with zeal and well formed plans thereby manifests capacity and will enlist at once the co-operation of his patrons and pupils. By arriving early at the place of his employment, by making the school room and grounds as attractive as possible for the opening of school, by a few friendly calls and even by polite requests for assistance, confidence is inspired and co-operation secured.

But it is not sufficient that the people have confidence in the teacher. The teacher needs abundant confidence in the people to inspire him. We believe that there are as many communities in which the teacher does not find in the people sufficient ground for confidence as there are in which the people fail to

provided that the member shall have fully complied with all necessary rules and regulations of the society in relation thereto, and to buy and sell real estate, and do all other things necessary or incidental to the purposes of the corporation. The amount of capital stock authorized shall be two thousand dollars, to be divided into forty shares of the par value of \$25.00 each, which shall be paid in as follows: Ten per cent. of the capital stock shall be paid in cash upon the organization and the balance in installments to be paid in cash in installments of ten per cent, as called for by the directors.
