Broward, Governor of the State of Florida, at his office in the Capitol building of said State, in the city of Tallahassee, for Letters Patent incorporating them, their associates and successors, into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, under the name of "Yaeger & Bethel Hardware Company," under the following charter and articles of incorporation, the original of which will be on file in the office of the Secretary of State of said State of Florida, at the city of Tallahassee, during the time required by law for the publication of this notice.

### CHARTER OF YAEGER & BETHEL HARDWARE COMPANY.

The undersigned hereby agree to become associated together, and do hereby associate themselves together, for the purpose of becoming a body politic and corporate under the laws of the State of Florida, the provisions of which are hereby accepted. The following articles of incorporation shall constitute and become its charter upon issuance of letters patent according to law:

#### ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation shall be "Yaeger & Bethel Hardware Company." Its principal office and place of business shall be at the city of Tallahassee, Florida. Branch offices may be established at such other places as may be selected by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE II.

The general nature of the business to be transacted by the said corporation shall be: To engage in business as jobbers and retailers of hardware of all kinds and descriptions; to buy, sell, export, import, and generally deal in mill, plumbers', miners, blacksmiths', steam fitters' and gas fitters' supplies; to buy, sell, export, import, and generally deal in tools, cutlery, saddlers' goods, iron and steel, guns and sporting goods of all kinds and description; to carry on the business of plumbing, tinning and mechanical engineering in all its various branches; to purchase, use, lease, sell and mortgage real and personal property; to loan money and to borrow money; giving its bonds, notes or other security therefor; and to have and to enjoy all the rights, privileges and powers necessary to the management and operation of said business.

#### ARTICLE III.

The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be twenty-five thousand dollars, divided into two hundred and fifty shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each; said capital stock shall be paid for in lawful money of the United States, or in property, labor or services at a just valuation, to be fixed by the corporators, or by the directors at a meeting called for such purpose.

#### ARTICLE IV.

This corporation shall exist for the period of ninety-nine years, unless sooner dissolved according to law.

#### ARTICLE V.

The business of this corporation shall be conducted by a board of not less than three nor more than five directors. The Board of Directors shall select from themselves a President, a First Vice-President, a Second Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. Said Board of Directors shall have authority to appoint all necessary agents of this corporation. Annual meetings of the stockholders shall be held at the principal offices of the corporation on the first Monday in each year, at 10 o'clock a. m. or as soon thereafter as practicable, at which the Board of Directors shall be chosen by the stockholders. The officers to be chosen by the Directors shall be chosen annually by them at the annual meeting to be held on the first Monday of each year immediately after the annual meeting of the stockholders. Until the Board of Directors shall have been first duly chosen by the stockholders, the business of the corporation shall be conducted by the following named persons and officers: Louis C. Yaeger, President; Lottie M. Yaeger, First Vice-President; Annie E. Bethel, Second Vice-President; and Henry L. Bethel, Secretary and Treasurer.

#### ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability this corporation shall at any time subject itself to be twenty-five thousand dollars.

#### ARTICLE VII.
