Northern Arizona Fair

In accordance with the policy of the Government, The Fifth Northern Arizona Fair will be held at Prescott, on October 18, 19 and 20th. Elaborate plans are now being made for the holding of this year's fair. To the citizens of Arizona and particularly those of the northern countries, Apache, Coconino, Mohave, Navajo and Yavapai, the Northern Arizona Fair needs little introduction. During the past four years from a humble start, this fair has grown into one of the leading permanent institutions of the State. Just what the Northern Arizona Fair is developing into is shown by the action of the last Legislature when state appropriation was made for the conducting and maintenance of this institution.

The purpose of the Northern Arizona Fair, as organized is to cultivate and foster a closer social and business relation between the residents and industries of the five Northern counties, in order that the varied and different resources of the several counties named may, by proper exhibition be more extensively advertised and higher degree of competitive improvement stimulated. The splendid success which has attended the Northern Arizona Fair but tends to show how truly the spirit of the organization has been carried out. The wonderful prosperity which has been paramount in Arizona since the beginning of 1917 will but add to the prestige of the Northern Arizona Fair exhibits, and particularly that of the mining industry.

Permanent improvements to the various buildings will be made within the next few days. It is now planned to erect a mining building, constructing it in the form of a cabin, made from logs of Northern Arizona. The agricultural building will be enlarged, floored and improved generally, as will also the livestock, educational, women and poultry buildings.

Exhibitors are earnestly requested to take pains in selecting their various goods for display and every one is asked to bear in mind the dates of the fair. In 1916, a splendid agricultural exhibit was made from Apache County, under the auspices of Mrs. E. J. Udall fair commissioner. Mohave county's mining State, due to the splendid work of Commissioner MacDuffee and the co-operation of the Mohave County Board of Supervisors. From Coconino County, exhibits were made in the livestock and poultry departments, which captured a majority of the first prizes. Although Commissioner F. O. Allen was unable to personally supervise a display in the agricultural department, many exhibits were displayed by individuals and a good showing made for Coconino County. Navajo County's exhibit was a revelation and received more than the usual share of praise. This exhibit was in charge of F. J. Willis. Yavapai County was well represented in all departments.
