Beef and Pork.

St. Louis, Feb. 13.—Gov. Humphrey of Kansas has selected St. Louis as the place, and March 12 as the time for the holding of the interstate convention to investigate alleged beef and pork combine.

Poor O'Brien.

DUBLIN, Feb. 13.—William O'Brien was taken from Trally to Killarney today, and arraigned for violating the crime act. O'Brien evoked Luggard. He asked for an adjournment on the ground that he had not been able to consult counsel. The request was granted, and a hearing set for Friday. A proclamation was circulated along the route from Trally to Killarney forbidding the gathering of crowds. O'Brien was escorted by the military.

A Mormon Defeat.

SALT LAKE, February 13.—In the election yesterday the Gentiles won the victory. The election was for city officers and the non-Mormons carried the entire ticket by a majority of nearly four hundred and fifty.

Some Objection.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—The Senate committee favorably reported the nomination of Norman J. Coleman to be secretary of Agriculture. An objection was made by a Republican Senator to its consideration, and a Democratic Senator objected to a discussion of the nomination. It is understood that the nomination will be confirmed.

The nomination of Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Thompson to be Civil Service Commissioner, and First Assistant Postmaster General Stevenson to be Judge of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, were made subject to the general rule respecting political nominations. Objections to Stevenson were made on political grounds. Thompson was objected to on the score of extreme offensive partisanship in the South Carolina elections.

The Parnell-Times Libel Suit.

LONDON, Feb. 13.—The cross-examination of LeCaron was resumed today. He had visited Europe five times in '67 and had reported to the government each time. In a conversation he had with Parnell in the lobby of the House of Commons, Parnell said he did not see why the insurrection in Ireland should not succeed. The English government had paid the witness ten thousand dollars between February '68 and August '70, but he claims he had expended it all for public purposes and had made no arrangement for any future reward. The witness claimed that the V. C. organization, numbering 23,000 members in America, openly advocated dynamite at its meetings in '81, and at Madison square garden in '84.

The Right of Way. WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—The following House bill passed granting the right of way to the Pima Land and Water Co. across the Fort Lowell military reservation in Arizona.

House.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 13.—The Senate bill to enable the President to protect the interests of the United States in Panama was referred to the committee on foreign affairs, and leave granted the committee to report at any time. The House resumed consideration of the Smalls-Elliott contested election case.

Time to Travel.

NEW YORK, Feb. 13.—Another war on commissions on emigrant fares to the Pacific coast has broken out. The movement is directed against the Southern Pacific which is not represented in Castle Garden but nevertheless secures a majority of the business. The opposition probably springs from the Santa Fe, Union Pacific and Denver & Rio Grande roads. The object is to force the Southern Pacific road into the pool and get it to divide profits. The opposition lines offer an open cut of \$13 on single tickets from New York to San Francisco.

BILLS INTRODUCED

Yesterday at the Capital City of Arizona.

Score One for Hicks and One for Daily.

SPECIAL DISPATCHES TO PROSPECTOR.

PHENIX, Feb. 13.—The following bills were introduced yesterday and referred to appropriate committees:

ASSEMBLY. A resolution was offered for the committee to proceed to Tucson and investigate the affairs of the Territorial university.

A bill to form the new county of Coconino and notice of a bill to attach a portion of Yavapai to Gila.

De Puy gave notice of a bill to abolish the offices of superintendent of public instruction and board of equalization.

Finn gave notice of a bill to prevent carrying concealed weapons.

A bill pertaining to the removal of Territorial officers.

A bill aiding a railroad to the Grand Canyon of the Colorado.

Hicks, of Cochise, introduced a bill to increase the salaries of clerks of supervisors in first-class counties.

Daily, of Cochise, gave notice of a bill exempting firemen from jury duty and poll tax.

COUNCIL.

A bill was offered to amend sec. 950, title 15, chapter III of the code; also a bill to amend title I, chapter XXVI of the code, relative to liens and judgments.

Council bills 4, 5 and six were reported back from the committee with a recommendation for their indefinite postponement, which was done.
