

Articles of Incorporation

OF THE VIRGINIA CHIEF MINING CO.

KNOW all men by these presents that we, the undersigned do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the territory of Arizona and we do certify

First, That the name of said corporation shall be THE VIRGINIA CHIEF MINING AND MILLING COMPANY.

Second, That the purposes for which it is formed are to carry on the business of mining for the precious and other metals and to buy, sell, lease and trade in mining property generally.

Third, That the principal place of business of this corporation shall be at Teviston, Cochise County, Arizona Territory but it may have a branch office at any other place, for the transaction of such business as the laws of the territory do not require to be transacted at the principal office.

Fourth, That the time of the existence of this corporation shall be 25 years.

Fifth, That the number of directors shall be three, and that the names and residences of those who are appointed to serve the first year are James H. Tevis, John A. Duncan and Ezra W. Kingsberry.

Sixth, That the amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be one million (\$1,000,000) of dollars, divided into one hundred thousand (100,000) shares at the par value of ten (\$10.00) dollars each, all of which is full paid.

Seventh, The existence of this corporation shall commence at the date of the filing of these articles, and shall terminate twenty-five years thereafter.

Eighth, The officers of this corporation shall be a president, a vice president, a treasurer, and secretary. The first three named shall be directors of said corporation and shall hold their offices for one year, or until their successors are elected and qualified and the secretary shall hold his office at the pleasure of the directors.

Ninth, The highest amount of indebtedness or liability which shall be incurred by this corporation at any one time shall not exceed \$100,000.

Tenth, Private property of the stockholders shall not be liable for the debts of the corporation.
