Cattle in The Territories.

The freight and live stock depart-
ment of the Santa Fe railroad has prepared
a statement of the live stock in the
territories of New Mexico and Arizona.
In New Mexico the principal shipping
stations are Silver City, Deming, O-
cola, Las Cruces, Engle, San Marcial,
Magdalena, Grants, Albuquerque, Wa-
trous, Springer, Las Vegas, Raton,
Lamy and Wallace. The total number of
cattle is 1,810,000; burros, 41,550;
mules, 5180. The number of steer cat-
tle, yearlings, up for sale that can be
shipped during 1891 is 369,000; to a
number of cars, 12,000. There are also
3000 car loads of wethers that are for
sale, and can be shipped to the num-
ber of 698,500 during 1891.

In Arizona there are now on hand
41,181 horses, 2347 mules, 847,500 cat-
tle and 4945 hogs. The number of
steer cattle, yearlings, up for sale
that can be shipped during 1891 is
211,875, or a total number of 6900
cars. The number of wethers for sale
this year is 97,000 head, or a total
number 3232 cars. The principal ship-
ping stations of Arizona are Navajo
Springs, Holbrook, Winslow, Flagstaff,
Ashfork, Hackberry, San Simon, Will-
cox, Benson, Pontano, Tucson, Hua-
chuca, Crittenden, Calabasas, Tempe,
Phoenix, Prescott.—Globe Democrat.
