The Big Convention In  
Session A Chicago

DANIELS IN THE CHAIR.

Silver Men Gain a Victory  
Over the Goldbugs' Stub-  
born Fight.

TELLER'S NAME CHEERED

General Happenings Through-  
out the Country.CHICAGO—The big convention as-  
sembled at 10 a. m. this morning,  
large crowds being present and the  
enthusiasm and excitement intense.  
Adjournment to this afternoon was  
taken during preparation for organi-  
zation. Thus far 12 candidates for  
the presidency have been named, six of  
whom will be formally presented.1:30 p. m.—Convention reassembled  
and in the selection for temporary  
chairman, first clash is now on.Clayton of Alabama has present-  
ed Hill for Temporary chairman and  
the silverites named Senator Daniels.  
Speech making is on and both sides  
are making a stubborn fight.A test vote will probably be made  
on the question. Intense excitement  
prevails as the silver men fear the  
goldbugs are taking advantage.2:30 p. m.—Daniels has floor and  
making eloquent speech in advocacy  
of free silver, 16 to 1. A reference to  
Teller's name causes prolonged ap-  
plause.3 p. m.—Daniels made temporary  
chairman amid the wildest enthusi-  
asm, and adjournment was taken till  
tomorrow. Silver men are elated.  
Chicago.—Silver republicans who  
bolted the republican platform have  
been putting forth every effort to se-  
cure the nomination of Teller. They  
do not feel they can support any other  
candidate. The silver republicans are  
determined to have Teller in the race  
whether he is nominated by the demo-  
crats or not.CHICAGO.—The anti-silver men have  
been at work all day. The delega-  
tions now in the city have been visited  
by men from the east and earnest  
arguments are made by those who  
hope to stem the silver tide. Their  
success has not been marked. No  
converts have been made and the  
silver men met them flat-footed with  
declarations that they intend to carry  
the convention, make a platform and  
nominate candidates.CHICAGO.—Boies' advocates do not  
favor a caucus for nominating a  
silver candidate and no abrogation of  
two-thirds rule.
