## LANDSLIDES

### And Washouts Cause Damage and Delay to the N. M. & A.

There has been some heavy rains on the line of the N. M. & A. between Fairbank and Nogales, and the wrecking crews have been kept busy repairing washouts.

Yesterday morning, however, when the train left Nogales for Benson on time they met a damaging washout from the terrific rains of the night previous. The wrecking crew in going to the scene of the trouble, also found several washouts which in all would estimate a delay of 10 hours before the train could pass. To make matters worse, a big land slide was also encountered which prevented any possibility of trade for a day or more, in fact, up to noon today, no train had yet reached Fairbank which accounts for the fact that no mail arrived in Tombstone last night; no train having gone to Benson to receive it.

It being evident that it will take a day or more to repair the damage by the landslides and washouts, the management will run an engine and car from Benson today with mail, etc., to the break when it will be transferred and thus, under this arrangement, mail will probably arrive tonight.

The loss from washouts on the N. M. & A. will be quite heavy this year owing the incessant rains.

The Republican Central committee meeting is being held this afternoon and are in session as we go to press. They will select delegates to the territorial convention and set dates for primaries and when and where the county convention will be held.

The new mill for the Golden Gate, Utah, Mining company, will have a capacity of 400 tons daily, and is expected to cost \$200,000. The calculation is that the entire cost of handling the ore, including treatment, will not exceed \$3 per ton.

Word comes from Florence, says the Citizen, that the old Orcha block in that place, was destroyed by fire on Wednesday night last. The loss falls heavily on Florence. The fire is supposed to be of incendiary origin.

## CATTLE THIEVES

### Arrested in New Mexico on the Road to a Long Term.

For the past two weeks, says the Deming Headlight, officers have been scouring the country in search of cattle thieves, and on Tuesday night were successful in making two arrests, and John Cox and Charles Shian are now in the toils charged by Uncle Sam with smuggling cattle into the United States from Mexico, the territory claiming that they have been in the habit of borrowing other people's stock within the territory.

The arrests were made by Deputy U. S. Marshal, H. W. Loomis and posse at the Horse ranch in the San Simon valley late Tuesday evening, after a hard ride through the Animas country, Skull and Skeleton canyons and in fact after covering that whole section of country.

Wednesday the arrested men were taken to Lordsburg before U. S. Commissioner, Don H. Kenzie, where they waived examination and were each placed under \$500 bond. They were then, Wednesday evening, brought to Deming by Deputy Loomis and Deputy Hardin of Lordsburg, and were yesterday taken before Justice of the Peace Louis I. Marshall, on a territorial charge of stealing cattle, and disposing of stolen cattle. To these charges, examination was also waived and each were placed under another \$500 bond, failing to give which, they were taken to jail at Silver City, to await action of the United States and Territorial grand juries.

The rain last night in Tombstone was a terrific one. Water fell in sheets and the streets were as a raging river. It lasted some time and is estimated that fully 2½ inches fell.
