They offered payment for the ranchman's steer which they had killed and assisted them in driving their cattle from the place. They were riding 96 brand horses and armed to the teeth."

## CONCERNING MEXICO.

### Some Facts of the Industrial Progress of the Nation.

The following facts relative to Mexico's progress are taken from Modern Mexico, an industrial journal. The statistics and finances speak for themselves:

There are 40,000 federal and 60,000 state office holders in Mexico.

The state of Chihuahua, with a population of 205,000, spends \$90,000 a year on its public schools.

Work has begun on an \$800,000 hospital in the city of Mexico.

The Mexican postoffice department will spend nearly \$1,500,000 during the next year.

The capital of the Banco de Londres, City of Mexico, will be increased to \$10,000,000.

Colonel Hampton has 2,400 men employed at present on the construction of the Mexico and Cuernavaca railway.

On the brow of the Hill Necotitz, Canton of Orizaba, Vera Cruz, a cotton and woolen factory is to be established on a grand scale.

The bed of the Conchos river in Chihuahua, is said to be full of ledges of the mother-of-pearl of the most beautiful varieties.

From estimates made on the vote for President Diaz last month the population of Mexico has increased about \$1,000,000 a year during the last three years.

The copyright treaty recently signed between Mexico and Spain provides unconditional protection of rights in literary and art productions between the two countries.

The Mexican congress has made an appropriation of \$250,000 with which a site is to be purchased for the new capitol. About \$1,000,000 will be expended on the building.

There will soon be completed in Alvarado, Vera Cruz, a dike which the government has ordered built in these waters. The event will be celebrated with appropriate festivities.

The cotton mills that are being built at the falls of Juanaacatan are to be completed about September 1. Machinery for running 28,000 spindles will be put in and that will furnish employment for 1000 operatives.

The various custom houses of Mexico collected a total of import duties during June amounting to \$1,624,576.44. Export duties collected reached the sum of \$122,094.97 for the month, and port duties nearly \$49,000. The new \$150,000 brewery is nearing completion at Chihuahua, and the Enterprise says there are more fine buildings in course of construction and more improvements being made in Chihuahua than at any period in the history of the city.

## "OUR MARK."

### The Los Angeles Herald Makes Some Predictions.

Los Angeles Herald: Hon. Mark Smith left yesterday at 2 p. m. for Arizona to open his campaign as the Democratic nominee for delegate to congress. Mr. Smith will make an effective canvass of every county in the territory. He will go from one end to the other, preaching the doctrine of free silver coinage and showing why William J. Bryan should be the next president of the United States. Ninety per cent of the voters of Arizona are for free silver. Bucky O'Neill the Populist candidate, is making a free silver canvass. He will get thirty per cent of the free silver vote. Mark Smith will have 60 per cent and the Republican candidate will have 10 per cent.

## THE IMPORTANT ISSUE.

### A Contributor Who Tells the Whys and Wherefores.

Ed PROSPECTOR:—In considering the changed conditions of the financial affairs of the United States in case Mr. Bryan is elected president and the free coinage of both gold and silver should become the policy of the country, it is well to consider the changes to be made in our banking system. We cannot have the assistance at heart. We should not have the assistance of the United States in maintaining the parity of the two metals gold and silver farther than making them a legal tender receivable for all demands public and private.

The great question that will attract public attention will be the best means or laws suited to make both metals redemption metals the same as gold is under the present financial system.

The argument made by the gold standard people that silver will drive gold abroad is certainly not logical. The greenbacks did not. The issue of the greenback was a flat policy pure and simple, without any intrinsic value in the greenback further than that it was a legal tender and receivable for all debts public and private, except duties on imports. Now, gold is the standard world wide. Can silver be maintained as of equal intrinsic value 16 to 1 is the great problem to be solved.

The instant congress sent forth its fiat that greenbacks would be received by the United States in payment of duties on imports and were exchangeable for gold at the United States Treasury, though the greenback had no intrinsic value, yet the fact that
