

**BISBEE NEWS.**  
Budget of Interesting Items from our Regular Correspondent.  
BISBEE, September 30, 1896.  
COPPERINGS.  
Joe McPherson came in this afternoon to pay us another short visit.  
A. H. Emanuel of Tombstone was also noticed among the incoming passengers.  
Mr. A. W. Smith and wife of Tombstone also came over for a short stay.  
Quite a number of Rebeccas came in on the train today from both Tombstone and Tucson. A lodge is to be started here tonight and quite a number is expected to join.  
Mr. E. G. Norton and family returned from a two months visit to Santa Monica and Southern California this evening. They are looking well and all enjoyed their trip.  
The balance of the Bisbee jurors returned from Tucson today. They were detained there a longer than they wanted to remain but had the pleasure of seeing the circus in the meantime. They all had a good time but think it came rather high.  
James Munch returned from Tucson today accompanied by his father. Mr. Munch has been away from home several years now and was on his way back when he was pleasantly surprised by meeting Jimmy in Tucson. They waited and came home together.  
Quite a little bustle and stir is manifested in the cattle business in this vicinity at present. The members of the outfit of M. M. Sherman, some 25 or 30 in number, were in town for some time yesterday making necessary purchases and returned to camp last evening. Mr. Sherman expected to pass 1,000 head of cattle through the custom house today, and we understand that that several other large shipments are also in waiting. Little is expected to pass about 600 head of yearlings in a day or so, and the Turkey Track and H. C. people will have 1,500 steers ready for shipment in a few days.
