PEOPLES PARTY PLATFORM

For President, W. J. BRYAN, of Nebraska.
For Vice-President, T. WATSON, of Georgia.
For Delegate to Congress, BUCKY O'NEILL.
I. The free and unrestricted coinage of gold and silver at the present ratio of 16 to 1 without regard to the actions or wishes of any other nation or combination whatever.
II. The increase of the current money to an amount sufficient to meet the wants of our growing population and business, such money to consist of silver and gold coin and U. S. Treasury notes, equally a legal tender for all demands public and private.
III. The abolition of all national banks and the establishment of Postal Saving Banks, managed and controlled by the U. S. Treasury.
IV. The establishment of a system of direct legislation by the people, giving to the people themselves the power, 1st. To veto all laws passed by any less than 95 per cent of all their representatives, and to propose the enactment of laws by any number greater than five per cent of the electors and compel their submission to the whole body of the electors.
V. That all means of transporting persons property and intelligence be gradually taken by the Nation and conducted and controlled by an unpartisan commission under strict civil service rules.
VI. That all public salaries and compensations shall be made to correspond to the price of labor and labor's product.

A Politician Kills Another to Resent an Insult.

McKINLEY HOSTS AT CANTON.

An Early Fire—A Collision With Fatal Results—Pursuit of Robbers.

MR. HANNA WILL VOTE.

WOODWARD, Okla.—Temple Huston a prominent politician, today shot and fatally wounded J. C. Jenkins. The trouble arose over the action of Jenkins in spitting in the face of Huston's son a few days ago, Huston is under arrest. A year ago today he shot and killed J. B. Jennings in a saloon fight in this city. Huston escaped punishment on the plea of self defense.

PHOENIX, Ill.—The building occupied by the Parsons Horological Institute and the Ide Manufacturing Co. was nearly destroyed by fire at 6 o'clock this morning; less \$100,000.

CANTON, O.—Canton's streets have been crowded all day. Forty carloads of cheering, flag-waving, finely uniformed and decidedly musical visitors crowded about the McKinley home. Pennsylvania, Ohio and Indiana sent their delegations. Pittsburg Italians waved Old Glory by the hundreds as they marched from the Pennsylvania depot at noon. Indiana shortly afterward tried to outdo them in music, cheers and a fine drill of handsome uniformed clubs. The men marched in good time and quickstep from Jefferson county, Pa. By the middle of the afternoon Market street looking to McKinley's house was filled with marchers.

HULL, Mich.—In a collision this morning on the Humber between the steamers Alexander and Eber the former sank, drowning ten of the crew.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn.—An Estherville, Iowa, special to the Journal says the country for nine miles about is being scoured by posses of armed men in search of the Sherburne bank robbers and murderers. Two suspects have been seen in Svea City giving their names as Armstrong and Graetinger.

BALTIMORE, Md.—Baltimore won the Temple cup series. The score today. Baltimore 5; Cleveland 0.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—A party of prominent men of Colorado are here on their way to Cortes to engage in a big mining venture there. They have valuable concessions from the government.
