UNDER WHICH FLAG?
"We are unalterably opposed to the single gold standard. We do not intend to see the immediate restoration of the free and unlimited coinage of gold and silver at the present legal ratio of 16 to 1, without waiting for the aid or consent of any other commercial nation. We demand that the standard silver dollar shall be a full legal tender, equally with gold, for all debts, public or private, and we will prevent the enactment of any kind of legal tender money by private contract."—Democratic platform, Chicago.

Senator Vest's conundrum for the goldbugs "How can you have two silver dollars, a 50-cent one for the wage earner and a 100-cent one for the mine owner?" is a poser.

John B. McLean of the Cincinnati Enquirer, offers to bet \$10,000 against \$8,000 that Bryan will carry Ohio, and \$20,000 against \$10,000 that Bryan will get more votes in Canton than McKinley.

The prohibition candidate for governor in Illinois withdraws from the contest and advises his supporters to vote for Bryan. The prohibitionists polled 45,000 votes in Illinois at the last election.

The fight for congress is between Mark Smith and Buckley O'Neill. Mr. Doran is standing on the wrong platform to catch many votes in Arizona. Buckley is making a gallant fight but of course cannot hope to be elected over Mark Smith.—Guardian.

He is coming back to America to labor for Palmer and Buckner. These gentlemen are said to be running for something and Col. Waterson evidently wishes to keep his head in.
