Yesterday morning her attorneys filed a complaint in an action against Richard V. Dey one of the appraisers appointed on Tuesday last, and in whose hands the much talked of compromise contract was placed, to quiet title to the property on the south-west corner of Pine and Sansome street, which she claims under a deed of gift alleged to have been executed in her favor by the deceased millionaire.

MEMPHIS, Tenn.—A brief telegram from Macon, Ga., states that 500 feet of platform fell there yesterday afternoon. Thirty people and 3,000 tales of cotton went down in a crash. So far fourteen injured have been taken out. Several are thought to be killed.
