CRUELITIES PRACTICED.

Crops and Houses Burned on Suspicious Pretexts—All Suffer.

AN ULTIMATUM DENIED

WASHINGTON—Reports were in quite general circulation here yesterday that Secretary Olney some time in November had given the Spanish government courteously but firmly to understand that the Cuban rebellion must be crushed within three months or the United States would be compelled to intervene to stop hostilities. No confirmation of the reports could be obtained in official circles here today. Consul General Lee has submitted to the secretary of state on the result of his observations in Cuba. Report presents very grave not to say horrifying condition of affairs in Cuba. Peaceable citizens are sufferers. If within the Cuban lines the Spanish destroy crops, burn houses and upon the slightest pretext it is all put men to death or imprison them on the ground that they are aiding the rebellion. Non-combatants within Spanish territory that is occupied by the Cubans are given like treatment on the ground that they sympathize with Spain. The report points out how men are often hurried to prison and condemned without trial. It also shows that cruelty is practiced on both sides but it states that cases have come to General Lee's knowledge of wrongs on the part of the Spaniards.

Sharkey is Awarded the Decision by Earp

DISSATISFACTION RESULTS

News From the Flooded Districts—The Leadville Strikers

DR JAMISON RELEASED

SAN FRANCISCO—The referee gave the fight to Sharkey in the eighth round on a foul. The decision aroused much indignation among the knowing sports.

SAN FRANCISCO—Wyatt Earp of Tombstone fame was the referee in the Fitzsimmons and Sharkey fight, and today is being much criticised for his decision in awarding the fight to Sharkey on technical grounds. It is not known what the result may bring forth. Earp will not recede from his decision.

DURAND, Wis.—The Chippewa river at this point has fallen five inches since morning. The ice jam at Round Hill is still firm and the river closed in but there is no further danger here unless the Chippewa gorge breaks. No lives have been lost in the bottoms as stated by the United Press. The loss of stock and property is heavy.

LEADVILLE—Judge Owens today filed bail in \$3,000 each in the cases of Charles Bone and Wm. Rowe, members of the Miners' Union, indicted for the murder of Fireman Jerry O'Keefe in the Coronado outbreak of September 27. Judge Owens criticised the newspapers which made comments on these cases saying they were guilty of contempt of court.

LONDON—Dr. Leander S. Jamison was released from jail tonight by order of the home secretary. Dr. Jamison underwent a serious operation on November 19th and his release was ordered on medical grounds. He was sentenced to fifteen months imprisonment in July last on a charge of violating the neutrality laws in invading a territory of the South African republic.
