THE RATE FIXED

The Territorial Board of Equalization Adjourns.

The Territorial Board of Equalization practically finished its work yesterday. The tax levy was fixed as follows: For the general fund, .31 on each \$100; insane asylum interest fund, .10; university interest fund, .02; Normal school fund, .02; school fund, .03; redemption insurance bonds, .03. The following levies provided by acts of the last Legislature were fixed: Support of Normal school, .03 on each \$100; Home for the Insane, three-tenths of a mill on each dollar; maintenance of the University, one-half mill, interest World's Fair bonds, one-half mill. The total rate of taxation is .02 2/10 less than it was a year ago. The total valuation, about \$1,000,000, is so far in excess of the valuation of previous years that at this lessened rate the income of the Territory will be increased. The subject of reducing the valuation of the A. & S. E. railroad was disposed of by reducing the assessment fixed at the June meeting, \$5,350.63 per mile, to \$5,300, the valuation of last year. No action was taken on the application of the Maricopa & Phoenix for a reduction.

A resolution was adopted providing for a meeting in Phoenix on January 24 of all the County Assessors in the Territory and one or more representatives from each Board of Supervisors. The object of the conference is to secure a uniformity in the manner of making assessments, etc.

Good reports of another find of rich ore in the Gold Cliff at Pearce was received by G. H. Fitts today. The rock is of peculiar color but big flakes of horn silver can plainly be seen while the assay value in gold gives a good figure. The ore is being stopped out and hoisted for shipment.

A party of Nogales mining men is being organized to go to the Yaqui river where the rich placer diggings were struck. The party will go by the Ajo mountains, then across to Batopilas range where they strike the Yaqui river and follow it down to the strike. Hon. Sam F. Webb and W. E. Pomeroy, of that place, will head the party.

The Southern Pacific company is now having about 100 teams and a large number of men at work on the track near Dagon Summit and Railroad Pass under the direction of the reconstruction department of the company, which is under the immediate charge of General William Hood, who has for many years been chief engineer of this vast corporation. There will be four miles of track in the vicinity of Dagon Summit and eight miles near Railroad Pass to be changed, placed out of the washes and on higher ground, besides strengthening the roadbed in other places.

A. L. Brooks the genial stage man had an interesting snake story to tell yesterday but he fully realized that at this season of the year snake stories are at a discount and furthermore no matter what reputation for veracity one may have unless proof positive is presented the story is more or less discredited. The rattler was killed in the road between here and Fairbank and by actual measurement is over 5 feet and 6 inches long. He had 13 rattles and a button.

THE PETRIFIED FOREST.

The Curious Geological Formation in Apache County.

Anson H. Smith, editor of the Mohave County Miner, has recently been on a trip to the great petrified forest, and has the following to say about the great natural wonder:

"Last Sunday the editorial force of the Miner visited, for the first time, the petrified forest of Arizona. The journey was made to Adamana, a small station on the Santa Fe Pacific road, in Apache county, from which point a conveyance carried the party to the 'forest,' six miles south. The formation of the country, seemingly, is sedimentary, and at one time covered by an inland sea. Erosion has uncovered a vast forest of trees that had been covered deep in sediment. The trees in every case are completely encased. As erosion took place the broken trunks of the trees were deposited on the low lands, a bewildering tangle of rainbow colors in stone. In one place an immense tree lies across a canyon, each end imbedded in a sedimentary formation, forming a natural bridge. What caused this great phenomenon will be speculated upon for years to come by the wise men of science, and when it has been explained it will still remain a marvel to the geologist. In every case the natural wood of the trees seem to have been preserved in stone. The colors and pines can easily be distinguished by the colorings. Fine trees in which decomposition had taken place prior to petrification are of notably white color and much softer in texture. This class of petrification would make excellent houses for cutter and harber's use. To one who has never seen anything of the kind a visit to the forest will amply repay for all trouble and expense. It only costs two dollars and fifty cents to go from the railroad station to the forest and return. Good accommodations can be had at the ranch of Adam Hanna, who with his good wife make a trip to the forest one of unalloyed pleasure.

A remarkable freak of lightning occurred last Saturday at Seligman. It had been raining around on the hills during the day, but no rain had fallen in town. About 4 o'clock in the afternoon a blinding flash of lightning struck the railroad yards where several hundred men were at work, with a deafening report, and knocking every man down. When they recovered from the shock it was found that two mules had been killed and the driver partly paralyzed in the lower limbs. Another man who had received a severe shock recovered sufficiently to resume work in a short time. When the quitting hour arrived he mechanically put his hand into his vest pocket to get his watch, but it was gone. He went to the place where he had fallen and there lay his watch. It had been melted into a molten mass. The man was burned across the breast by the electric fluid, but no other evidence was visible of his narrow escape from sudden death.—Mohave Miner.


