A Grant Discussion.
 An important ruling has been made by the secretary of the interior in relation to the reservation of land grants from settlement.

In the case of the Tumacacori grant, a Mexican grant within the Gadsden purchase in Arizona, the secretary has decided that the eightieth edition of the act of July 22, 1854, applied to the Mexican and Spanish land grants. In Arizona arid lands to the extent of the claims made before the surveyor general of those territories were placed by the law in the reservation until the final act of congress confirming or rejecting the claims. Final action, however, is now delegated to the court of private land claims, consequently the reservation will continue until final action by that court.

This decision reverses that of the commissioner and forbids him to open lands claimed by grantees to settlement.

Arizona at Chicago.

The Star says that Pima county will send the finest cactus exhibit of any county or territory or state in the union. It will consist of three carloads and aggregate forty-five tons in weight. Every obtainable variety and the best specimens of each comprise the collection. Of course the biggest suahuaros, sixty feet high could not be well shipped, but some specimens were large enough to open eastern eyes. Five of them weighed 16,000 pounds and one weighed 3375 pounds. The century plants have been in blossom for weeks. The collection is now being loaded at the railroad for shipment.

A New Phase.
 A new phase was placed upon the McAllister-Nichols suit last night by the action of plaintiff's attorneys in dismissing the action commenced several weeks ago. This places the matter before the court on the issues contained solely in the mandamus proceedings, which will come up tomorrow.
