C. T. Hayden of Tempe has assigned to J. A. Ford. He made an assignment to the same party six years ago.

Chas. R. Wores came in today from the west. He will look after his ore shipping business during the next few days.

The bicycle manufacturers say that they expect to double their output this year and take in \$40,000,000 from the American people.

Mickey Stewart died at Flagstaff yesterday of consumption. He made a gallant fight against the dreadful disease, but succumbed at last.

W. R. Spector, railroad agent at Crittenden, was tried by jury in Justice Meyers court in Tucson yesterday on a charge of trespass, and acquitted.

Phoenix has come to the front as the possessor of an intimate friend of Blanche Lamont, the woman who was murdered by Durant in San Francisco.

The report of the carnival in tonight's Prospector was written by our special society reporter, Alvan W. Howe, and reflects credit upon his reportorial ability.

The American bicyclist, who was making a tour of the world, was shot dead in Armenia by Turks belonging to the national guard. This will be the cause of an international row unless it shall be determined by President Cleveland that bicycling is not "honest" sport.

Since the killing of two Chinaman in a mysterious manner, one in Tucson and the other in Nogales, the mongolian store keepers are arming themselves for self protection.

The assertion of George Gould that the Castellane count did not get a dollar of Anna Gould's money is discredited by the report that as soon as the count reached Europe he set out for Monte Carlo.

The Chinamen in Arizona appear to be suffering the fate of their unfortunate brother across the water. A roof of a restaurant at Tucson fell in on two mongols on Wednesday and all but killed them.

Tomorrow the election for school trustee will be held. There appears to be little excitement over the affair. F. N. Wolcott will probably be a candidate but no other name has been mentioned as yet.

W. C. Green passed through Nogales last week from the San Domingo placer mines. He is working 40 men and has developed a bed of gravel ten feet in thickness that carries ten cents per pan of coarse gold. His claims cover over eleven miles of that section.

Every one who lived in Tombstone ten years ago remembers W. S. Fleming and family, who afterwards moved to Crittenden. A few months ago they went to Washington state and have made up their minds to remain there. Mr. Fleming, who was a staunch republican, has found the populist party.

The officials of the North and South road deny the rumor that the preliminary survey for the extension of the road to Nogales is about to begin. Nearly the entire amount of the funds have been subscribed by the towns, but as yet very little has been collected and the railroad will do nothing until the subscriptions are cashed.

The Ritter building on Allen street was put up by A. J. Ritter in 1884. It is two stories high, and was constructed with the idea in view of making it stand for a lifetime. Iron braces run through the building in such a way that not a foot of the walls have gone out of plumb. Inside were used over 15,000 feet of best Oregon and sugar pine. The partition are nearly all double. Overhead are seven large, airy rooms. Everything used in the construction of the building is of the best. The Easter services at the Hall last Sunday evening were attended by an appreciative congregation. An attractive program, consisting of songs and recitations appropriate to the season, was rendered.

Mrs. Ed Scott gave birth to a twelve pound girl a few days ago, and it was feared that she would not live, but she is now improving rapidly.

Chas. Mason will soon commence to lay out the pipe lines for supplying the city with water.

Losing the road is the great fad in our city at present.

A large amount of sulphide ore is taken from the mines at present.

Sinking will soon be commenced on the Holbrook shaft to extend it 100 feet further.

A gold wire artist is visiting our city and is doing a good business.

Frank Hiles, the insurance agent, is spending a few days with us.

The I. O. O. F. are to have to have a celebration here on the 26th inst.

The Miners' restaurant was closed last day, and Mr. Radovich, the proprietor, is rapidly disposing of the furniture. Mrs. Radovich has gone to her home in California.

Frank Hodges, an old timer on this coast, came in on yesterday's train. He was one of the California boys in blue who came through this country during the rebellion, and has lived in Arizona, New Mexico, and Colorado ever since. He is a native of Maine.

A. H. Heineman, of Washington, an inspector of U. S. Indian schools, is in Tucson and is investigating Fort Lowell as to its fitness for the establishment of an Indian School. He says that the authorities are impressed with the fact that more schools should be established for the Indians, and that Arizona should be especially favored in this respect.

For Cattle Men

Dr. Salmon, chief of the bureau of animal industry which is a sub-department of agricultural development, has been interviewed on the cattle shortage and said: For some time past cattle have been getting scarcer and scarcer in the west, and especially in the southwest. The condition of the grass has been so poor, cattle have well nigh disappeared entirely. In southwestern Texas, for example, where there used to be tremendous herds, there are practically none today. There has been a great improvement in the grass in Texas and other western states, but the cattle are not there to take advantage of it. This is one reason that influenced the department in its decision to raise the embargo on cattle from Mexico. Mexican cattle have been looked upon with disfavor for the reason that Texas fever is known to exist on the other side of the border and a quarantine has been kept up in the summer.
